#### Source B: The Bluewater code of conduct










## Source D: Fuels used to generate electricity in the UK in 2006

	In favour	Against
Gas	Reliable, cleaner than coal.	Significant CO <sub>2</sub> emissions, rising gas prices.
Coal	Cheap, reliable, falling levels of $CO_2$ emissions.	High $CO_2$ emissions, acid rain, running out of coal.
Nuclear	Very small $CO_2$ emissions, efficient and reliable.	High cost of building, safety concerns, problem of nuclear waste.
Hydro-electricity	Renewable, no $CO_2$ emissions, very cheap once built.	Danger of drought, impact of large dams.
Wind	Renewable, no $CO_2$ emissions, quick to build.	Noisy and ugly, more expensive than fossil fuels.
Solar	Free and renewable.	Sunshine not regular in the UK, high cost to set up.
Wave and tidal	Renewable, potentially good in the UK.	High development costs, possible tidal effects.
