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(b) Describe how Muslims celebrate Eid-ul-Adha.

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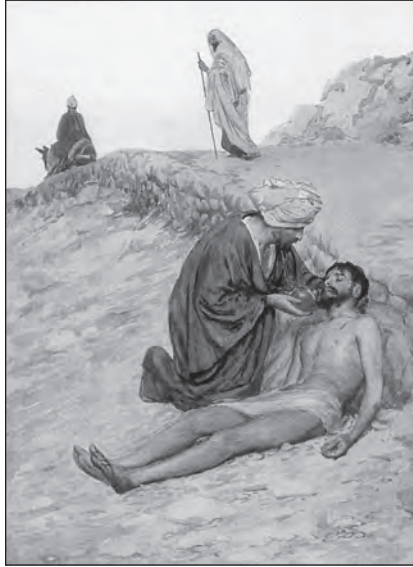
