You could include details of:

- the procession to the harbour and the sacred ship
- the atmosphere at the spring festival
- other activities you take part in with fellow worshippers
- the powers of Isis.

(b) How did religion help to make life in provinces such as Britain more like life in Rome?

You could include details of:

- what the Romans thought of non-Roman gods
- the worship of gods and goddesses such as Sulis Minerva at Bath
- emperor worship and its effect on people in the provinces.

9 (a) Imagine you are a follower of Mithras. What do you like about being one of his worshippers?

You could include details of:

- the powers of Mithras and hope of life after death

- your feelings about being one of his followers.

(b) Why did the Romans make offerings and sacrifices to the gods?

You could include details of:

- the types of occasion when they made offerings and sacrifices
- the part played by the haruspex or soothsayer
- worship in the family home.
