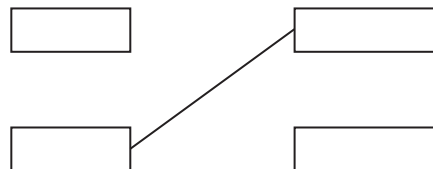

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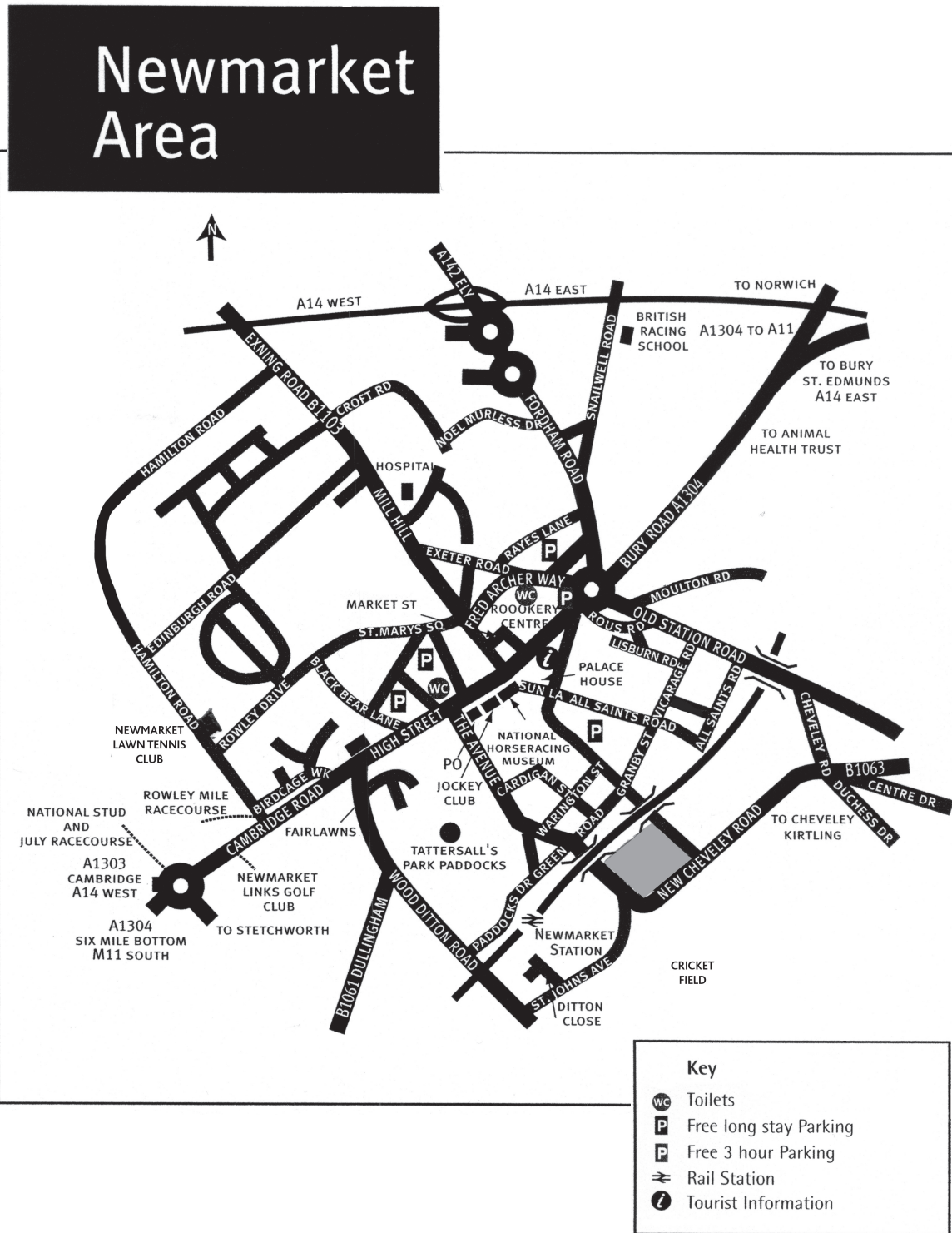

### STEALTH AT THORPE PARK

Thorpe Park is now one of the top theme parks in England. It was opened in 1970 and covers 500 acres of land. It is located near the M25 and London.

In 2006 Thorpe Park opened Stealth, the UK's tallest launched roller coaster. With a track height of 205ft, the jet-propelled Stealth ride launches up to 20 riders towards the heavens at 128km/h and back down again. Stealth towers above the horizon at Thorpe Park, a gigantic curved shape standing out on the skyline and dwarfing the Tidal Wave track that is next to it.

Stealth is a humongous ride, and is bound to be very popular with visitors to Thorpe Park.
