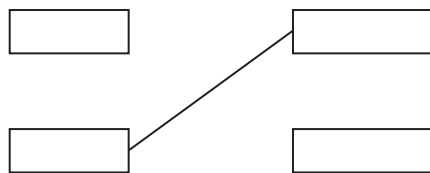

Option A: By air

Flight from Bristol to Edinburgh

Read the following article before answering Questions 9(c) and 9(d).

December 2007 - London Heathrow Terminal 5

There are a number of projects making up the Terminal 5 building plan. These include:

- diverting two rivers
- moving the airport's western outer road
- bridge and roundabout construction
- landscaping works on the surrounding area.

The new terminal will consist of a main building, two satellite buildings, 60 aircraft stands, a multi-storey car park and much more.

The new airport terminal has implications for local transport and travel to the airport. As a result of this, major redevelopments to roads and public transport in the area were included in the conditions for the development of the terminal. These redevelopments are to include extensions to the Heathrow Express train and Piccadilly tube lines to central London, a bridge on the A3044 over the M25 and a new railway station exclusively for Terminal 5 passengers.

Facts about London Heathrow Terminal 5

- Terminal 5 will be able to handle 30 million passengers per year. This will make Heathrow the world's busiest airport.
- The new terminal building will be big enough to fit around 50 football pitches across its five floors.
- The terminal's control tower will be the highest in the UK.
