

Manchester Airport trials naked-image security scans

An x-ray machine that produces "naked" images of passengers has been introduced today at Manchester Airport's Terminal 2. The full body scanner will enable staff to instantly spot any weapons or explosives. It will also reveal a clear outline of false limbs and body piercings.

The scan's black and white image will be seen by one officer in a remote location of the airport and will be deleted immediately.

Travellers can refuse the virtual strip and choose a traditional 'pat down' search instead.



However, a spokesperson for the airport said,

"most of our customers do not like the traditional 'pat down' search, they find it too intrusive but still want to be safe. This scanner takes away the hassle of needing to remove your jacket, belts, shoes etc., and will speed up the check in and security process".

Comments from passengers on the scanner included...

"It has just taken me 25 minutes to go through security. Anything that makes this process faster would be welcome".

"Yes I would mind, I would be unhappy having an x-ray which produced a naked image of me, even if it is destroyed straight away, it's just not right".

"If this speeds up and improves security, I cannot see a problem – it is for our own safety".

"I'm pregnant and I don't want an x-ray because it could harm my baby".
