The extract is a sequence from the E4 situation comedy *Scrubs*, set in a hospital.

There are 7 main characters in this programme:

JD The doctor whose thoughts we hear.

Elliot Reid The female doctor with the mobile phone.

Chris Turk The doctor who looks at Elliot's mobile phone.

Bob Kelso The head doctor who eats the muffin. Perry Cox The doctor who says 'your breath'.

The Janitor The caretaker, in a blue overall, who has named the bird.

Carla Espinosa The nurse with the large birthday card.

Advice – Viewing the Extract

- You will have 45 minutes to read all the questions, view the extract and make notes.

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Answer each section of every question separately.

- 1 (a) List two features of the extract that fit the conventions of the situation comedy genre. [4]
 - **(b)** Briefly explain how **each** feature is typical of the situation comedy genre. [4]
- 2 Scrubs has some features that are unusual for a situation comedy. Pick one example of each of the following and explain how it is unusual:

•	the camera work	[4]
•	the editing in the title sequence	[4]
•	the soundtrack	[4]
•	the special effects.	[4]

3 Discuss how the extracts suggest Scrubs might attract a young adult audience.

You may consider: the characters, the casting, the script, and the overall style of the programme.

4 In this question you are asked to write about situation comedies you have studied.

You may **not** use *Scrubs* as your main choice, but you may discuss how the two programmes you have studied are similar to, or different from, Scrubs.

- (a) Identify three conventions that are commonly used in the situation comedy genre. Discuss why they are so common using two programmes as examples. [12]
- (b) Explain two audience pleasures of situation comedy and show in detail how at least two different programmes offer these pleasures. [12]
