INSTRUCTIONS FOR TEACHERS



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GENERAL

- The DVD extract is for use with the GCSE Textual Analysis and Media Studies Topic: Moving Image (B322) question paper.
- The DVD contains four screenings of the extract for analysis and the correct amount of time in between each screening for note-making. There is no need for the invigilator to stop or rewind the DVD.

**CHECKING PROCEDURES: TWO WORKING DAYS BEFORE THE EXAMINATION
(Thursday 14 June 2012)**

- The arrangements for screening the DVD on the day of the examination should be planned in advance. It is permissible to use classrooms with one or more television sets or to use a projector in a large space. You must ensure all candidates have a clear view of the screen and are able to hear the DVD easily.
- You should check that your DVD player equipment is working correctly.
- Before the day of the examination, play the DVD through once in order to check sound and picture quality. Ensure that this check is done under secure conditions in your Centre. In the event of any problems with sound or picture quality that are not caused by your DVD player equipment, you should contact OCR's Question Paper Despatch Team.

SCREENING THE DVD ON THE DAY OF THE EXAMINATION

- Ensure that all candidates have a clear view and can hear easily.
- Once the DVD starts candidates must be allowed three minutes to read all the questions on the question paper. The extract will start automatically after three minutes.
- The question paper contains instructions to candidates on when to make notes. You should ensure that all candidates follow these instructions.
