- You must include a recorded realisation of the composition on cassette tape or CD.
- You must complete the evaluation of your composition and realisation during the examination on Friday 7 May, 2004.

#### 1 Music for Film

Compose music for this scene from a western film. It falls into three sections. You may find it helpful to use the suggested timings.

- 0'00" A peaceful sunrise over a vast open prairie with birds soaring high above in the hot thermals/air currents.
- 1'12" The camera gradually zooms in on an area of increasing activity around the circle of covered wagons.
- 1'55" The 'big theme' is heard as the wagon train pulls away.
- 3'30" End of opening scene.

#### Your music should:

- contain a passage which portrays a peaceful sunrise over an open prairie with birds soaring high above;
- have musical ideas that show the gradual increase in activity;
- have a clear and recognisable 'big theme'.

#### **Suggestions for related listening**

Any western film score that gives a sense of either an open prairie or a gradual increase in activity or includes a 'big theme'. Examples could include *High Noon*, *The Alamo*, *The Big Country* or *The Magnificent Seven*.

#### 2 Music for Dance

Compose a piece of dance music using the distinctive characteristics of **EITHER** the salsa **OR** the samba **OR** the tango.

#### Your music should show:

- an understanding of the distinctive characteristics of the chosen dance;
- an appropriate use of form or structure;
- a suitable choice of instrument or combination of instruments.

## **Suggestions for related listening**

*Popcorn*, *Fernando's Hideaway*, *Guitar Tango*, tangos by Astor Piazzolla (1921-92). There are many compilation CDs available, including *Salsa Collection* and *Tango Collection* on HMV Easy.

#### 3 Orchestral Landmarks

Compose a piece of music which relies for its effect on changes of texture and/or timbre.

#### Your music should show:

- an understanding of the effects produced by changes of texture and/or timbre;
- changes of texture and/or timbre;
- a sense of form or structure.

## Suggestions for related listening

Any example of music which relies for its effect on changes of texture and/or timbre. There are examples from across the Area of Study. Listening might include:

- (a) Classical Haydn and Mozart
- (b) 1800-1830 Beethoven and Schubert
- (c) 1830-1900 Brahms, Bruckner, Debussy, Mahler and Tchaikovsky
- (d) 20<sup>th</sup> century Adams, Bartok, Reich and Stravinsky
- (e) changes of texture within fugal writing

## 4 The Popular Song since 1960

Compose a popular song in a style typical of a ballad.

#### Your music should:

- show understanding of the characteristics typical of a ballad;
- use suitable chords;
- have an appropriate form or structure;
- show appropriate use of vocal **and** instrumental resources and/or technology.

## Suggestions for related listening

Any example of a ballad from 1960 onwards. Listening might include:

- (a) Yesterday The Beatles
- (b) Miss you nights Cliff Richard
- (c) Massachusetts The Bee Gees
- (d) Lady in Red Chris de Burgh
- (e) I just called to say I love you Stevie Wonder
- (f) Candle in the wind Elton John
- (g) Everything I do, I do it for you Bryan Adams
- (h) May it be Enya
