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Introduction

In the new GCSE specification, the Panjabi Writing test will be untiered to cater for students of all abilities. The flexible, unitised structure will also allow them to maximise achievement. Marks allocated to this unit are 50 and the test carries 25% of the total marks.

Students will be required to write, in Panjabi:

- a short list or to complete a form, which demonstrates their ability to write words or phrases. (Question 1)
- a text, which offers the opportunity to use a variety of structures, expressing their personal opinions. (Question 2)
- a text which offers the opportunity to write descriptively or imaginatively, expressing and explaining ideas and points of view, eg an article, a letter, publicity material. (Question 3)

Purposes for Question 2 and for Question 3

Students are offered a choice of contexts and purposes for Question 2 and for Question 3:

- Question 2 (a) is drawn from the context Lifestyle; 2 (b) is drawn from Work and Education. Students answer either 2 (a) or 2 (b).
- Question 3 (a) is drawn from the context Leisure; 3 (b) is drawn from Home and Environment. Students answer either 3 (a) or 3 (b).
- Students must have access to a dictionary in the Writing test.
- Stimuli will be in Panjabi and suggested content points will be in English. Question 2 and Question 3 are likely to require approximately 100 words each. However, provided the task is completed, the number of words is not important.
- Students should use a variety of structures and include different tenses.
- In Question 2 students will need to express personal opinions and will need to refer to two tenses.
- In Question 3 students will need to express and explain ideas and points of view and to refer to three tenses.

The bullet points provided in Questions 2 and 3 are not prescriptive. Students do not have to respond to these bullet points. Instead, they may include their own ideas and points of view.

- The mark awarded for Range of Language must not be more than one band higher than the mark awarded for Content. (See table below).
- The mark awarded for Accuracy must not be more than one band higher than the mark awarded for Content. (See table below)
- If a mark is awarded for Content, this will inevitably lead to the award of a mark for Range of Language and for Accuracy.
- If a mark of zero is awarded for Content, this will automatically result in a zero score for Range of Language and for Accuracy.

Although answers to questions 2(a), 2(b), 3(a) and 3(b) will be marked according to the above assessment criteria, however, some examples of possible answers are given below as guidance. Students are allowed to include their own ideas and they can write similar answers in several different ways.

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





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Student 1 – Commentary

Question 1

The student has answered the question and mentioned 3 items out of 4 correctly and scored full marks.

Total marks = 2/2

Question 2 (a)

The student has answered parts of the tasks correctly. The response is mostly limited to the task with some relevant information and the content is relevant to the task. The student has completed few tasks. The student's point of view about seeing a doctor and further advice to his friend to feel better could have been developed further. The content fits in the criteria for 'Limited' and 6 marks are awarded.

Content = 6 marks

A variety of vocabulary and structures are used. The use of verb forms is mostly correct and there are longer sentences with correct use of tenses. This fits in the 3 marks band in this criteria.

Range of Language = 3 marks

Verb and tense formations are usually successful and the work is more accurate than inaccurate. There are some spelling mistakes but the intended meaning is clear. A mark of 3 is awarded for accuracy.

Accuracy = 3 marks

Total marks = 12/24

Question 3 (a)

In this question, the response is very limited but to the point. The student gives some examples and expresses opinion. The student's point of view did not cover the context of the task fully. The content fits in the 'Limited' range of criteria and 6 marks are awarded.

Content = 6 marks

A variety of vocabulary and structures are used. The use of verb forms is mostly correct. Complex sentences are attempted and are usually successful. There is evidence of three times frame used. Therefore, a mark of 3 is awarded.

Range of Language = 3 marks

Verb and tense formations are usually successful and the work is more accurate than inaccurate. There are quite a few spelling errors but the intended meaning is clear. A mark of 3 is awarded for accuracy.

Accuracy = 3 marks

Total marks = 12/24

On the whole this student is able to show some understanding of the tasks but has missed completing a few tasks and lost marks. In some parts of the questions he answers wrongly. He was able to address the requirements of the tasks but provided limited information.

Total marks for Student 1 = 26/50



Total marks = 2/2

Question 2 (b)

The student has answered most of the tasks correctly. The response is mostly limited to the task with some relevant information. Points of views are expressed but could have been developed further. The content fits in the criteria for 'Sufficient' and 9 marks are awarded.

Content = 9 marks

A variety of vocabulary and structures are used. The use of verb forms is mostly correct and there are longer sentences with correct use of tenses. This fits in the 4 marks band in this criteria.

Range of Language = 4 marks

This work is generally accurate. Verb and tense formations are usually correct. There are some spelling mistakes but the intended meaning is clear. A mark of 4 is awarded for accuracy.

Accuracy = 4 marks

Total marks = 17/24

Question 3 (b)

In this question, the response is very limited but to the point. The student gives some examples and expresses opinion. The student's point of view did not cover the context of the task fully. The content fits between the criteria for 'Limited' and 'Sufficient' so 7 marks are awarded.

Content = 9 marks

A variety of vocabulary and structures are used. The use of verb forms is mostly correct. Complex sentences are attempted and are usually successful. There is no evidence of three tenses used. Therefore, a mark of 3 is awarded.

Range of Language = 3 marks

Verb and tense formations are usually successful and the work is more accurate than inaccurate. There are quite a few spelling errors but the intended meaning is clear. A mark of 3 is awarded for accuracy.

Accuracy = 3 marks

Total marks = 13/24



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

Student 3 - Commentary

Question 1

The student has answered the question and mentioned 3 items out of 4 correctly and scored full marks.

Total marks = 2/2

Question 2 (a)

The student has answered all the tasks correctly. The information is conveyed clearly, explaining ideas and points of view. The content is fully relevant to the task. The candidate has handled complex structures with confidence. However, the student's point of view about eating unhealthy food could have been developed further. The content fits in the criteria for 'Good' and marks at the top of the band are deserved so 12 marks are awarded.

Content = 12 marks

A good variety of vocabulary and structures are used. The use of verb forms is mostly correct and there are longer sentences with correct use of tenses such as ਜੇ ਤੈਨੂੰ ਹਰ ਵੇਲੇ ਸੁਸਤੀ ਪਈ ਰਹਿੰਦੀ ਹੈ , ਬਾਹਰ ਜਾਣਾ ਚਾਹੀਦਾ ਹੈ, ਤੂੰ ਆਪਣੇ ਮਿੱਤਰਾਂ ਨੂੰ ਮਿਲ ਸਕਦਾ ਹੈ ਂ This fits in the 5 marks band in this criteria.

Range of Language = 5 marks

This piece of work is mostly accurate. There are minor spelling mistakes while attempting more complex sentences. A mark of 4 is awarded for accuracy.

Accuracy = 4 marks

Total marks = 21/24

Question 3 (b)

In this question, the student has demonstrated a satisfactory understanding of all the tasks. She has made attempts to use complex sentences and her answers are relevant and to the point. The information is conveyed in detail explaining ideas and points of view. The points on opinions are elaborated fully. Overall, the content fits in well within the band 'Good' and 12 marks are awarded.

Content = 12 marks

There is evidence of a range of vocabulary and structures. The use of verb forms is mostly correct. Complex sentences are attempted and are usually successful such as: ਜਦੋਂ ਮੈਂ ਕੰਮ ਕਰਨ ਲੱਗ ਪਈ ਫਿਰ ਮੈਂ ਆਪਣੇ ਪੈਸੇ ਕਮਾ ਕੇ ਕਨੇਡਾ ਜਾਵਾਂਗੀ There is evidence of three times frame used. Therefore, a mark of 5 is awarded.

Range of Language = 5 marks

Verb and tense formations are successful and the work is generally accurate. There are very few spelling errors. A mark of 5 is awarded for accuracy.

Accuracy = 5 marks

Total marks = 22/24

On the whole this candidate is able to show good understanding of the tasks. She is able to complete all the tasks successfully and demonstrate her ability to address the requirements of the tasks and provide relevant information. She has made attempts to use complex sentences successfully. She is able to develop her ideas, express opinion and has elaborated on all points.
