B5 (c) Jesus healed a woman with a haemorrhage. Explain what Christians might learn from this healing. *(6 marks)*

B5 (d) ‘Jesus healed people because he cared about them, not because they had faith.’

Do you agree? Give reasons for your answer, showing that you have thought about more than one point of view. Refer to Luke’s Gospel in your answer. *(6 marks)*

Do **not** answer Question B6 if you have answered Question B5.

B6 The Authority of Jesus

B6 (a) Give an account of the healing of the paralysed man. *(6 marks)*

B6 (b) 'Jesus had no right to say that the paralysed man's sins were forgiven.'

Do you agree? Give reasons for your answer, showing that you have thought about more than one point of view. *(6 marks)*

B6 (c) Son of Man and Son of God are titles of Jesus used in Luke's Gospel.

Explain what these titles show about Jesus' authority. *(6 marks)*

B6 (d) 'It should have been clear to everyone who met Jesus that he was the Messiah.'

Do you agree? Give reasons for your answer, showing that you have thought about more than one point of view. Refer to Luke's Gospel in your answer. *(6 marks)*
