Imam leads prayers / Friday sermon / religious teacher / religious ceremonies / advice and guidance / explains the Qur'an.

Muezzin calls people to prayer from a minaret.

Women as a distraction / practical issues – looking after family / modesty / privacy / some women would prefer to worship separately.

Eid ul Fitr as a happier occasion / release from fasting / importance of giving fitr / special foods, clothes, gifts / parties / importance of visiting the mosque / thanking Allah / importance of visiting relatives, etc.
