2 (a) Explain what is meant by global warming.

Target: Understanding of the term global warming

The scientific concept that the world is getting warmer / because of the build up of greenhouses gases in the atmosphere.

Credit examples, e.g. melting of ice caps, increase in CO2 in atmosphere because of emissions from cars, etc.

2 (b) Explain two reasons why many religious believers are concerned about climate change.

Target: Understanding of why religious believers are concerned about the effects of climate change

Candidates may include some of the following points:

The effects of climate change on life, e.g. loss of life, food shortages, devastation of livelihoods because of severe weather, droughts, floods, famine, destruction of crops, effects on plants and animals / long term effects / religious reasons – stewardship, dominion, responsibility, etc.

2 (c) 'Planet Earth is God's world.'

What do you think? Explain your opinion.

Target: Evaluation of whether or not the world belongs to God

Levels	Criteria	Marks
0	Unsupported opinion or no relevant evaluation.	0 marks

Level 2	Opinion supported by one developed reason or two simple

Candidates may include some of the following points:

God / Allah created the world – religious beliefs about the origins of life / wasn't an accident but was designed / belongs to God / God is in all sentient life / idea of awe and wonder / reference to sacred writings.

God might not exist / where is the evidence that the world belongs to God / caused by the Big Bang – an accident / humans rule the world – so it belongs to us / God is in heaven (paradise).

3 (d) Explain actions religious people might take to look after the planet.

Target: Understanding of how religious people could help to protect the planet

Candidates may include some of the following points:

Avoid polluting the world / recycle / reduce carbon footprint – reduce use of car, use renewable energy, turn off lights, use energy saving bulbs / encourage sustainable development / plant trees / protest when necessary / join action groups such as Greenpeace and religious organisations which raise awareness / encourage others to protect the planet, etc.

3 (e) 'It's more important to enjoy life than to worry about using up the world's resources.'

Do you agree? Give reasons for your answer, showing that you have thought about more than one point of view. Refer to religious arguments in your answer.

Target: Evaluation of the importance of enjoyment and the world's resources

Candidates may include some of the following points:

Agree

Life is too short / only live once / cannot be thinking of the future all the time / won't affect me / need to have a good time / other resources will be found / God gave humans dominion, so we can do what we want / Hindu aim in life – Kama.

Other views

Not necessary mutually exclusive / need to concerned for future generations / natural resources will run out, e.g. oil / needs careful managing – idea of good stewardship / khalifahs (guardians) / Genesis 1 – put in charge to look after the world / interdependence of everything / responsible to God / selfishness affects others / Golden Rule (in all religions) / karma / reincarnation / seeking too much pleasure – craving results in suffering.
