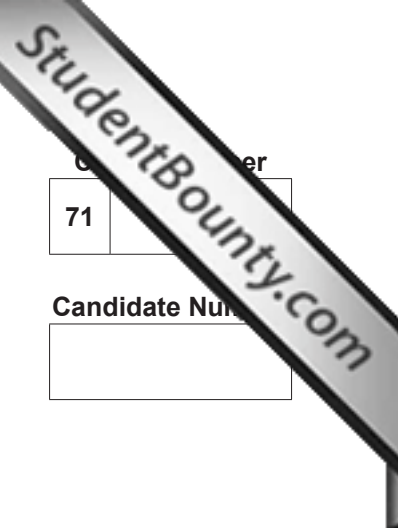

3 The Ministry of John the Baptist

At that time John the Baptist came to the desert of Judea and started preaching. ² “Turn away from your sins,” he said, “because the Kingdom of heaven is near!” ³ John was the man the prophet Isaiah was talking about when he said: “Someone is shouting in the desert, ‘Prepare a road for the Lord; make a straight path for him to travel!’ ”

¹¹ I baptise you with water to show that you have repented, but the one who will come after me will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. He is much greater than I am; and I am not good enough even to carry his sandals. ¹² He has his winnowing shovel with him to thresh out all the grain. He will gather his wheat into his barn, but he will burn the chaff in a fire that never goes out.” ¹³ At that time Jesus arrived from Galilee and came to John at the Jordan to be baptised by him. ¹⁴ But John tried to make him change his mind. “I ought to be baptised by you,” John said, “and yet you have come to me!” ¹⁵ But Jesus answered him, “Let it be so for now. For in this way we shall do all that God requires”. So John agreed. ¹⁶ As soon as Jesus was baptised, he came up out of the water. Then heaven was opened to him, and he saw the Spirit of God coming down like a dove and alighting on him. ¹⁷ Then a voice said from heaven, “This is my own dear Son, with whom I am pleased”.
