9(a)		 Typically the main features are: Sanctuary - This is the area around the altar it is the holiest part of the church and is usually raised on steps and is likely to point towards the East Altar - This is the table in the sanctuary which the priest stands behind to celebrate Mass Tabernacle - This found in the sanctuary and is where the consecrated hosts are held after Mass Crucifix - This is the cross with the body of Jesus hung on it, It is usually found in the Sanctuary area and is often hung over the Altar Font - This is where babies are baptised Confessional - this is a small room usually divided in two in which the priest will hear Confession(the sacrament of reconciliation) Lectern (pulpit) - This is where the priest and readers will stand to read from the Bible and give the homily. Stations of the Cross - These are 14 pictures spread around the church which show the story of the death of Jesus Statues - There is likely to be a statue of Jesus, There may also be a statue of St Peter and some other saints Holy water stoop - At the entrance to the church are bowls containing water. A priest has blessed it and it is called holy water. Other approaches are possible and must be marked according to the levels.
