many different people have many different opinions on what is family.

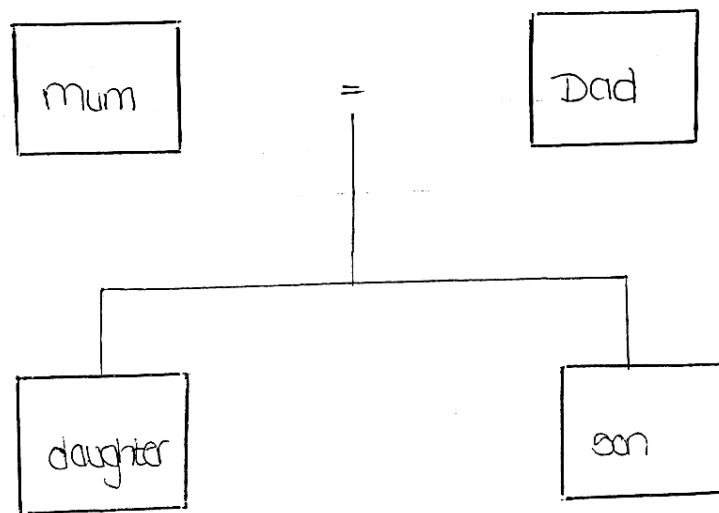
Some people say it's a mother, father and their children and some people say it's a larger group of relatives and other come out with completely different answers.

A description of a nuclear family.



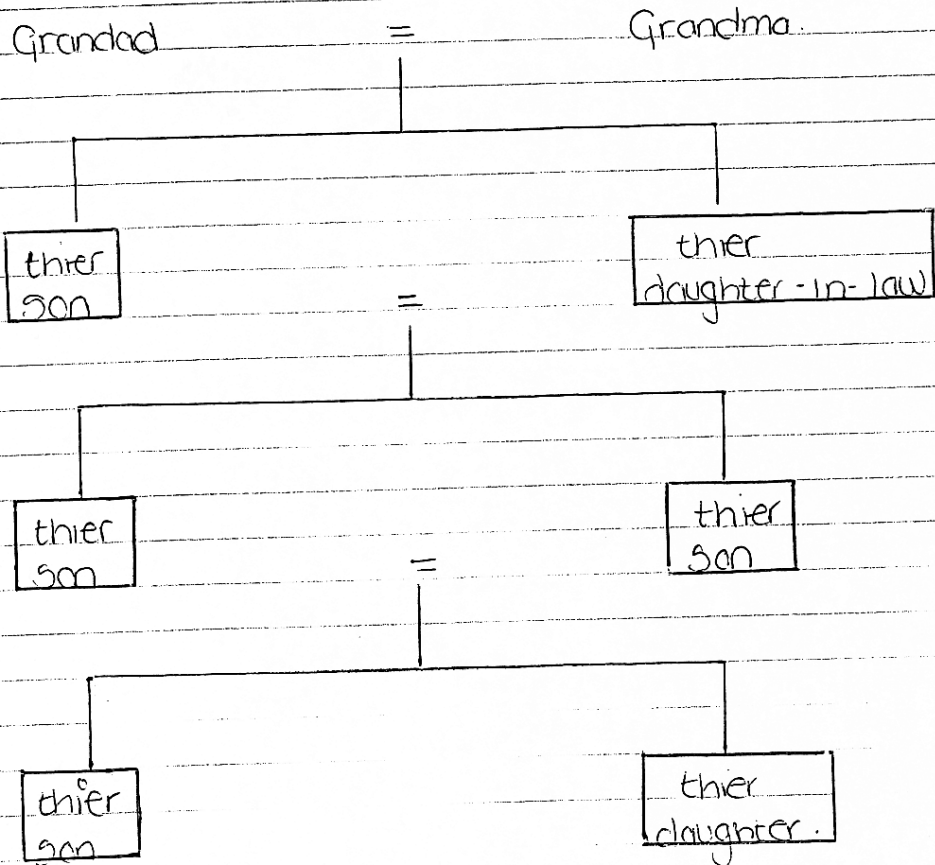
Extended family.

A extended family is known as a family that is supportive.

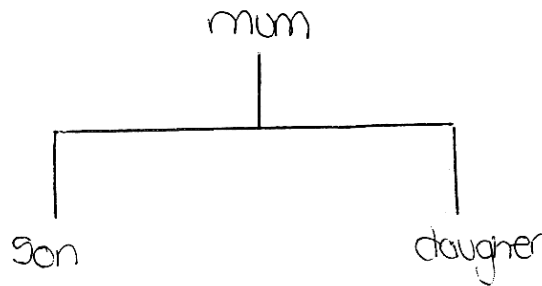
Description of an extended family.

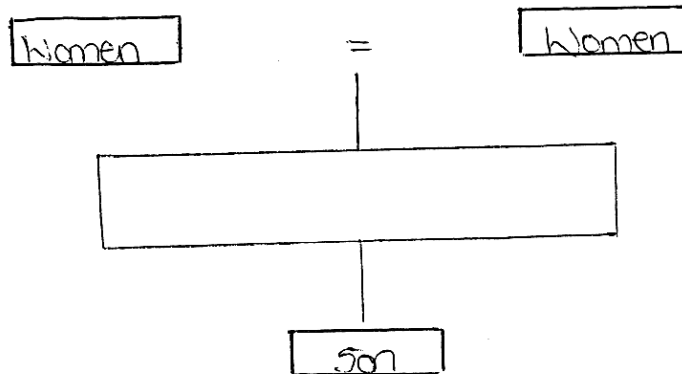
A description of a single-parent family.

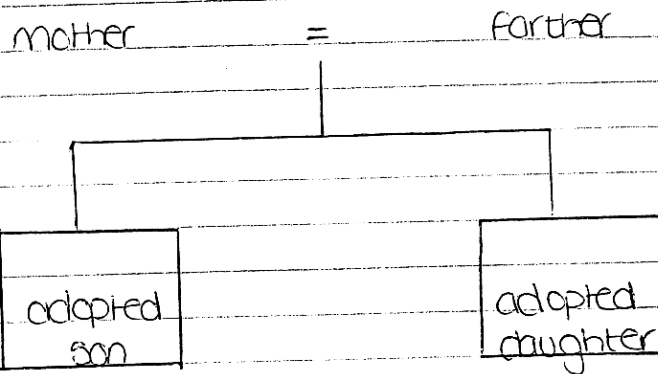
Description of gay family.

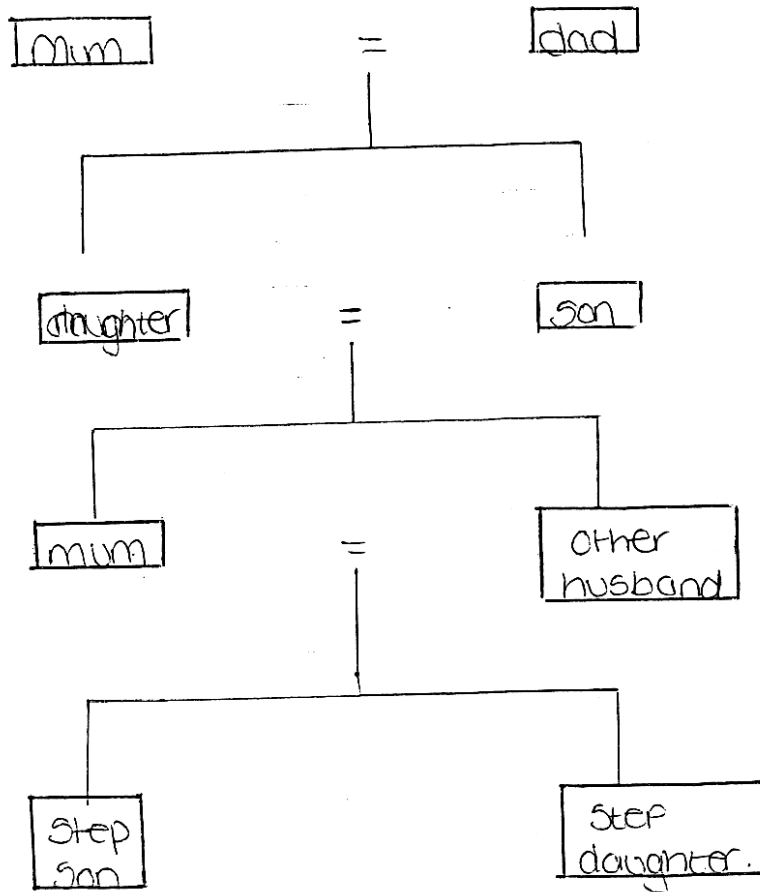
Description of adopted family.

A step family is a family that the female was involved in a relationship but has a divorce and get involved with someone else and they have children so they have step brothers and sisters.

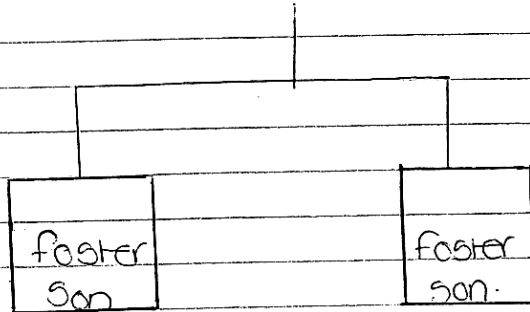

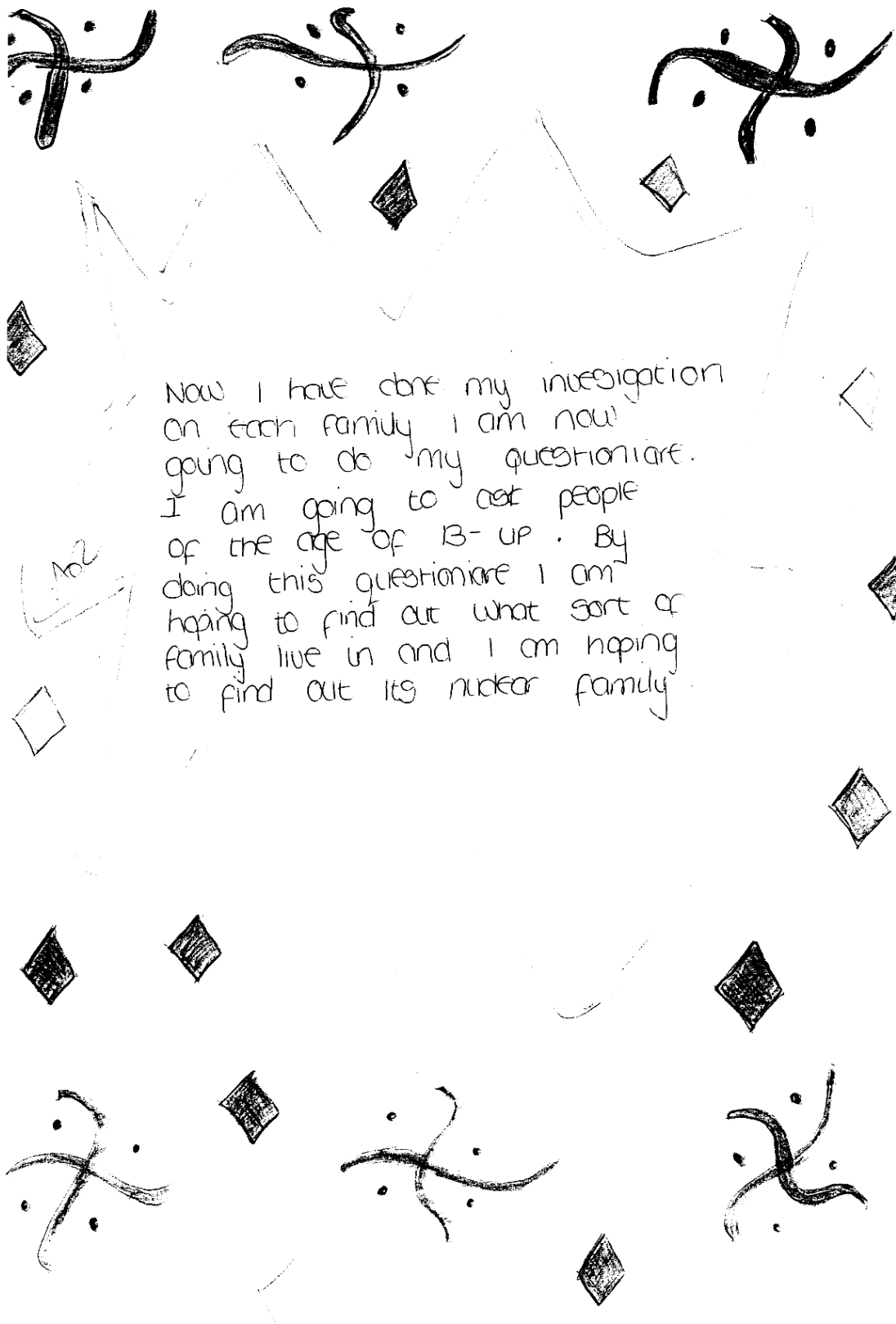


Foster Family

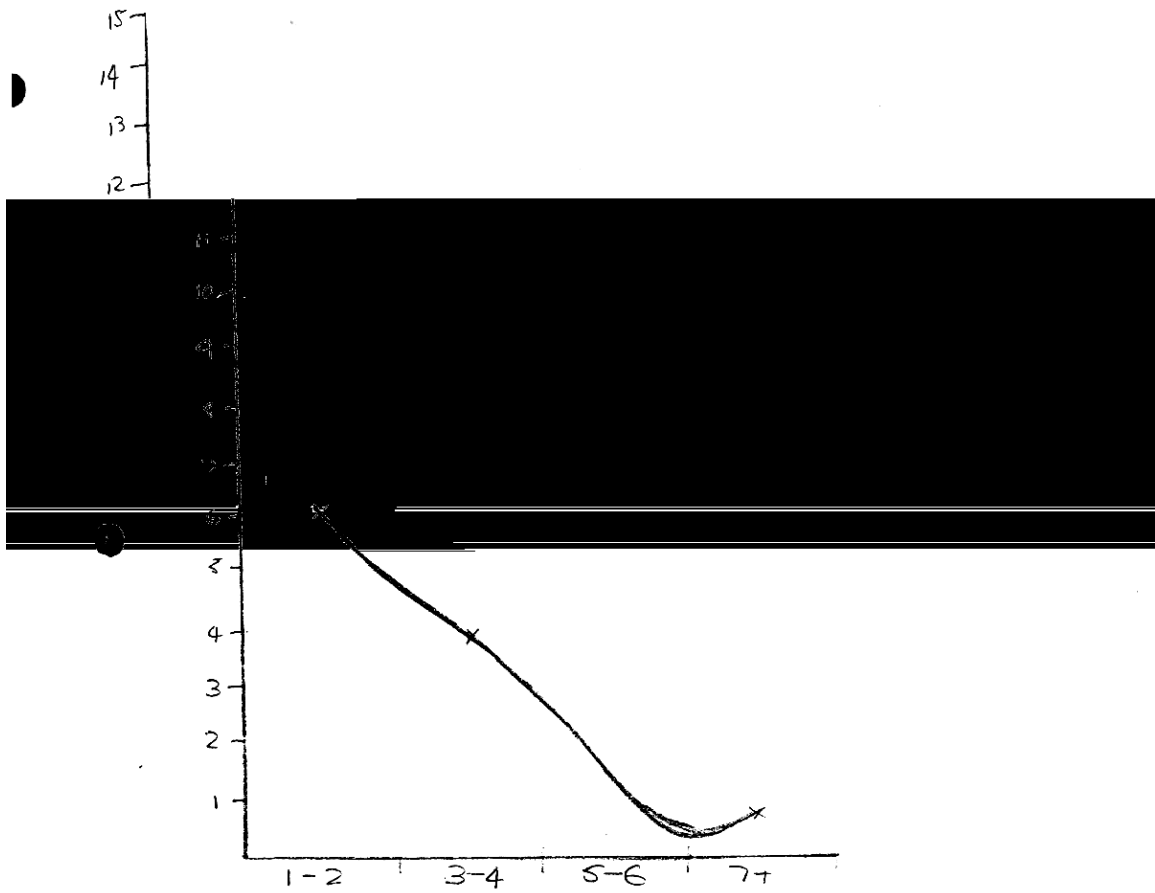

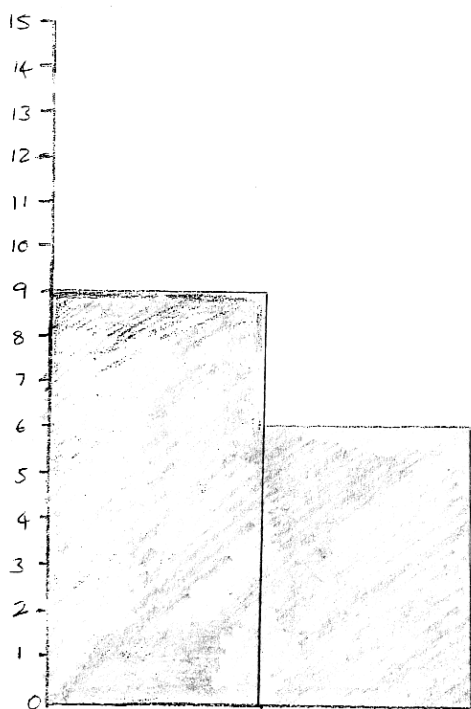

have.

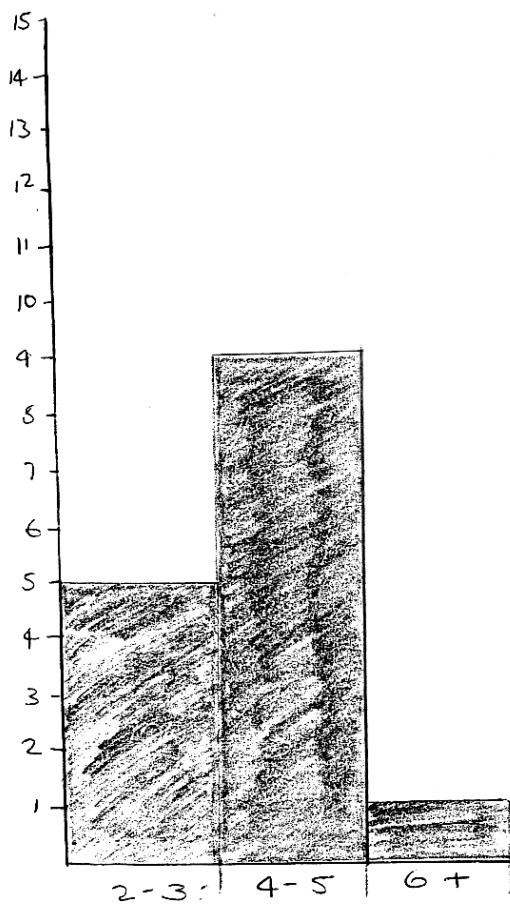


Age

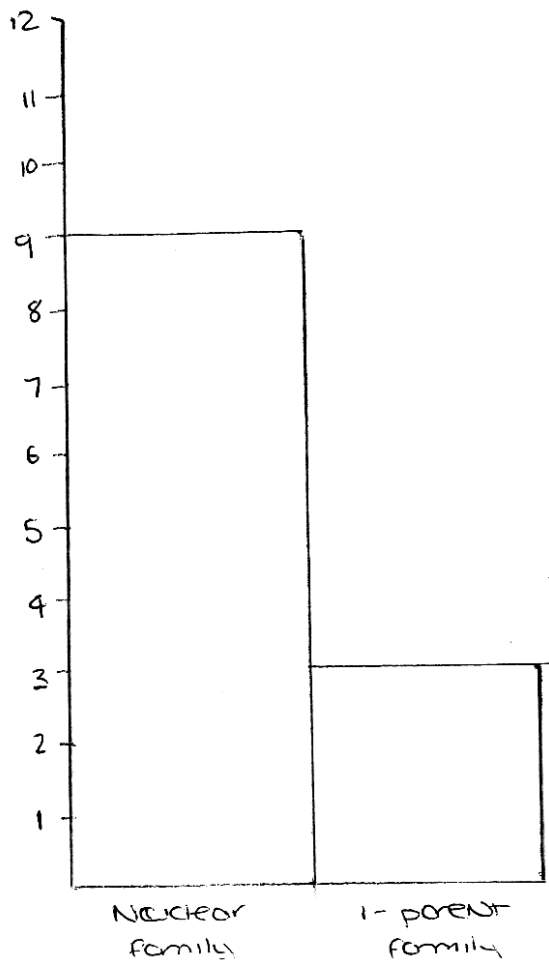

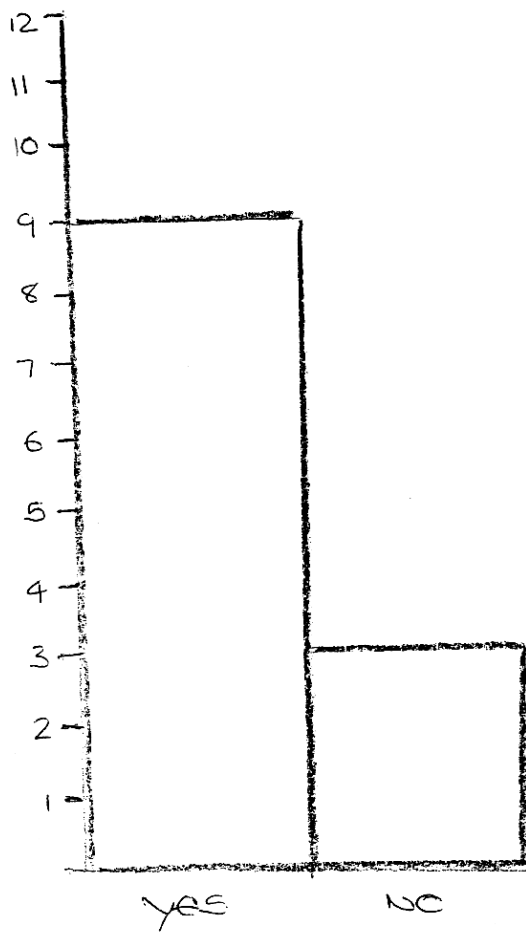

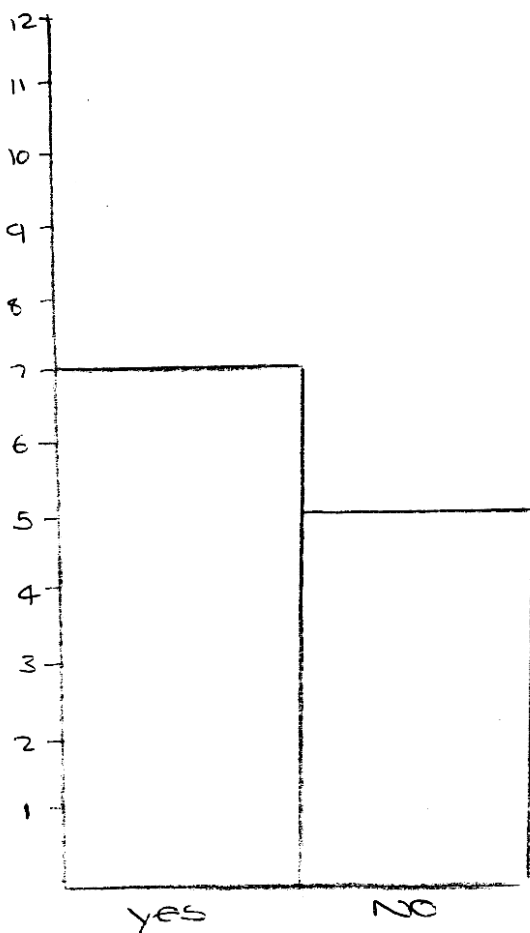
A bar chart to show

people live in.



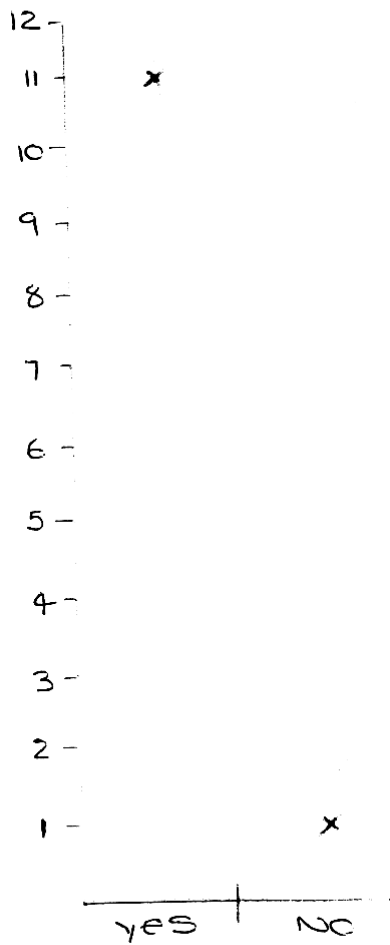
A bar graph to show

birth parents.



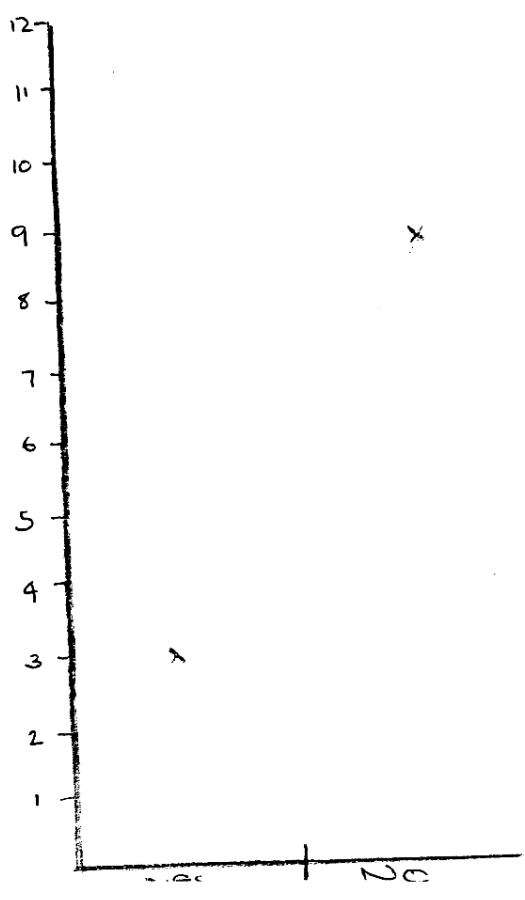
A bar chart to show if

born (real) blood?



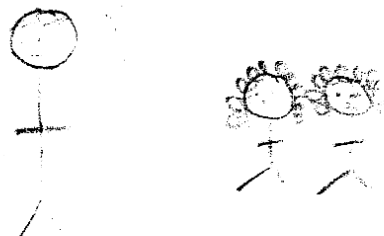

Conclusion
