- to use a variety of vocabulary, different types of sentences and different verb tenses.

You can use your own ideas **or** you can include these ideas:

- 1 who you are and details about where you live;
- 2 information about your family, e.g., who they are, what they do, what they like;
- 3 describe what you have done or will do with your family and what you feel about it;
- 4 whether or not you think it is important to do things as a family and why;
- 5 what changes you would like to see in your family life and why.

Question 2 Health and sport

You write about sports facilities in your area, for a Turkish-language newspaper to be distributed across the UK.

Remember:

- to give factual information **and** explain ideas and points of view (your own and/or those of others);
- to use a variety of vocabulary, different types of sentences and different verb tenses.

You can use your own ideas **or** you can include these ideas:

- 1 what sports you and your friends do;
- 2 where you do them and what the facilities are like;
- 3 some details about a sporting activity and how you feel about it;
- 4 whether or not facilities for sport are important and why;
- 5 changes you would like to see in the provision of sports facilities and why.

Question 3 Leisure and entertainment

You have an idea for a special day out with a friend or group of friends. You contact them about your plans.

Remember:

- to give factual information **and** explain ideas and points of view (your own and/or those of others);
- to use a variety of vocabulary, different types of sentences and different verb tenses.

You can use your own ideas **or** you can include these ideas:

- 1 the place you want to visit and how to get there;
- 2 details about the activities you can do there;
- 3 why it is important to have a day out together;
- 4 the reasons why a past trip was good or bad;
- 5 what other activities you would like to do for a special day out and why.

Question 4 Travel and the wider world

A Turkish-language TV station is running a competition to win a dream holiday for four people. You have to describe your idea of the perfect holiday and say why you deserve to win it. The best entry will see that dream come true! This is too good to miss, so you write an entry.

Remember:

- to give factual information **and** explain ideas and points of view (your own and/or those of others);
- to use a variety of vocabulary, different types of sentences and different verb tenses.

You can use your own ideas **or** you can include these ideas:

- 1 who you are and what type of holiday you like;
- 2 activities you do on holiday;
- 3 details of your ideal holiday, e.g. people, destination, travel, accommodation;
- 4 reasons why you and your friends deserve this holiday more than anyone else;
- 5 what you will do instead if you do not win and why.

You want to write an article for a family magazine in Turkey about 'teenagers and work experience'.

Remember:

- to give factual information **and** explain ideas and points of view (your own and/or those of others);
- to use a variety of vocabulary, different types of sentences and different verb tenses.

- 1 who you are and your work-experience job;
- 2 describe the jobs you and your friends do;
- 3 describe an activity you have done or will do for your work experience and how you feel about it;
- 4 whether or not it is important to do work experience and why;
- 5 how work experience has been or will be useful to you and reasons why.
