In 1987, Wong Yan Lung was accepted to the Bar in England. He was also accepted to the Bar in Hong Kong in the same year. Nevertheless, he does not forget his social responsibility after his success. He became a volunteer since 1991 and visited street sleepers every week and served them by cutting their hair. He even tried to sleep on the street in order to experience the taste of street sleeping. He also donated his wedding gifts valued at several hundred thousand dollars to the association.
