TEXT A



- Rose Gilbert is old enough to be the great great grandmother of her students at Palisades Charter High School in Los Angeles. The 91 year old teacher has been doing the same job for 55 years. Although she is a millionaire she refuses to retire.
 - At just 16 years old, Babar Ali became headmaster of his own school in West Bengal. The hard-working boy has 326 pupils to look after. People think he is the youngest headmaster in the world. He organizes the school in his family's garden and checks that the pupils attend regularly and that homework is handed in on time.
 - A deaf dog called Sparky has learnt sign language with the help of the Missouri School for the Deaf. The owners of Sparky abandoned the dog. Now it lives at the school and the pupils have taught the dog to understand three commands: "sit", "lie down" and "stop". He is in the process of learning "food" and "outside". Another deaf dog has recently joined the programme.
 - Mary-Lu Kennedy was the first of 12 students to graduate with an MA (a master's degree) in "The Beatles, Popular Music and Society" at the University of Liverpool in the United Kingdom. Newspapers have criticized the degree as "useless" but Mary-Lu says that "the course was challenging and enjoyable. It helped me understand the influence of The Beatles on all aspects of life."
- The world's smallest school, which consists of 4 students and a 12 square metre classroom, is situated in a tiny village called Kalou in southern Iran. The school has been officially recognized by UNESCO as the smallest in the world. It now receives gifts every day: textbooks, computers and even chocolates.



Martin Luther King celebration: a day of service

Martin Luther King Junior said "Everybody can be great ... because anybody can serve. You don't have to make your subject and verb agree to serve. You only need a heart full of grace."

For twenty-five years, Martin Luther King Junior's life has been celebrated as a national holiday. Hundreds of Kauaians* are expected to meet on Monday to honour his message of peace. Martin Luther King said that he wanted to be remembered as someone who served the community. For that reason, his family asked that Martin Luther King Day is, above all, a day of service.


Martin Luther King celebrations include a very full two hour programme with live entertainment and presentations from leaders of all religions. Monday's celebration will emphasize youth involvement and volunteer opportunities. From 11 am to 1:30 pm at the Kauai Grove Centre, local artists, religious leaders, volunteer organizations and politicians will work together in a programme designed to inspire youth and adults to take action in their communities. A dozen volunteer organizations will be there to distribute information. People who want to come to the celebration but who cannot volunteer can still contribute to it: they can bring food for people in need or give unwanted cell phones to be recycled.

"The celebrations are always moving because there are people who entertain with music or prayer," said Jim Jennings, the director of the local hospice. "This year's programme is going to be a mix of politicians talking about Martin Luther King, organizations talking about volunteer opportunities, different island artists, poetry reading and music."

The programme will open with a traditional Hawaiian greeting. Different religious leaders will talk.

According to Jim Jennings, Kauai is an example of tolerance and diversity. "There's lots of different people living together and helping each other. Kauai is a good example of how Dr. King encouraged communities to live."
