- **2.** Do you think global issues unite or separate nations?
- 3. Can a foreign language influence another language and/or culture to any significant extent?
- **4.** Many kinds of media such as newspapers and television rely on advertising or sponsorship. In your opinion, is the influence of commercialism on the media positive or negative, and why?
- 5. In a society you have studied, which is more important to combat today, gender discrimination or racial prejudice, and why?
- **6.** Compare and contrast the main conflict in the literary works you have studied. In what ways does the conflict contribute to the development of the story?
- 7. To what extent is revenge justified in the works you have studied?
- **8.** Discuss how minor characters are used to illustrate the ideas or themes contained in the works you have studied.
