Language and culture

1. Either

(a) With reference to your study of this option, consider the idea that jargon or slang is crucial in how particular groups of people define themselves.

or

(b) Discuss the idea that bilingualism means much more than simply communicating in two languages. In your answer include examples from your study of this option.

Media and culture

2. Either

(a) Journalism is rarely objective. Consider with reference to your study of this option.

or

(b) Discuss some of the ways in which the mass media have shaped your understanding of the past. Include examples from your study of this option.

Future issues

3. Which recent developments in technology will create balance and stability in the future? Include examples from your study of this option.

Global issues

4. With reference to at least two global issues you have studied, discuss how action at a local level can have national and international consequences.

Social issues

5. Which social issues most require immediate attention and why? Refer to at least two social issues you have studied.

Literary questions

6. Either

(a) "Fear of failure is our main motivation to act." Discuss this statement with reference to at least two works you have studied.

or

(b) Sometimes dishonesty is defensible. Discuss with reference to at least two works you have studied.

or

(c) How important is the ending to a work of literature? Refer to at least two works you have studied.
