Complete one of the following tasks in at least 400 words.

- 2. A much-loved teacher at your school is retiring from teaching. - 3. You are a journalist sent to report on the effects of a natural disaster such as an earthquake or a flood. You observed the effects of this disaster, you saw the extent to which the victims were being helped, and you spoke to some of the people involved. Write your news story.
