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These notes are not intended to replace the published criteria but to supplement them in some instances.

These notes are intended to define the **top** of the mark scale in this examination. The phrase, "a good answer", is intended to refer to scripts which are likely to be placed in the 9 to 10 band of descriptors. Scripts should be marked proportionately lower to the degree to which they fail to meet these descriptors.

In each case, good answers will meet **most**, though not necessarily **all**, of the following requirements.

1. A good answer

- will be in the format of an informal letter
- may not have an address but will have a date
- will use the friend's name in the salutation, not "Dear friend"
- · will explain clearly why the character was disliked
- will not be a mere re-telling of the story, though excerpts from the story will be used as illustration
- will adopt a register in the range informal to very informal
- may include quite a bit of "youth-speak"
- will adopt a relaxed, friendly style.

2. A good answer

- will have a general title
- will utilize sub-headings, bullet points or the like
- will deal with clubs in general, not just one particular club
- will show methodical organization
- may foresee possible problems once the club is in operation; this should be rewarded
- may take into account the age range of club members; this should be rewarded
- will adopt a register in the range semi-formal to informal and, for effect, may fluctuate within this range.

3. A good answer

- will adopt a clear structure, whether paragraphs or points, which makes the sequence of events obvious
- may adopt the format of a formal report; this should be rewarded but should not be demanded
- will address all of the questions "Where?" "When?" "Who?"
- may include a conjecture in answer to the question "Why?"; this should be rewarded
- will be made accurate and vivid by, for example, giving speeds and distances
- will adopt a formal register.

4. A good answer

- will explain the situation clearly
- may give examples; this should be rewarded
- will suggest whatever actions should be taken to improve the situation
- will give considerable detail
- may show that the candidate has been able to put himself or herself in a relevant situation and explain this situation to the readers; this ability should be rewarded
- will adopt a register in the range formal to semi-informal
- will adopt a style such as to win hearts and minds
- may be evocative; this should be rewarded.
