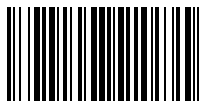
Translate **one** text into English.

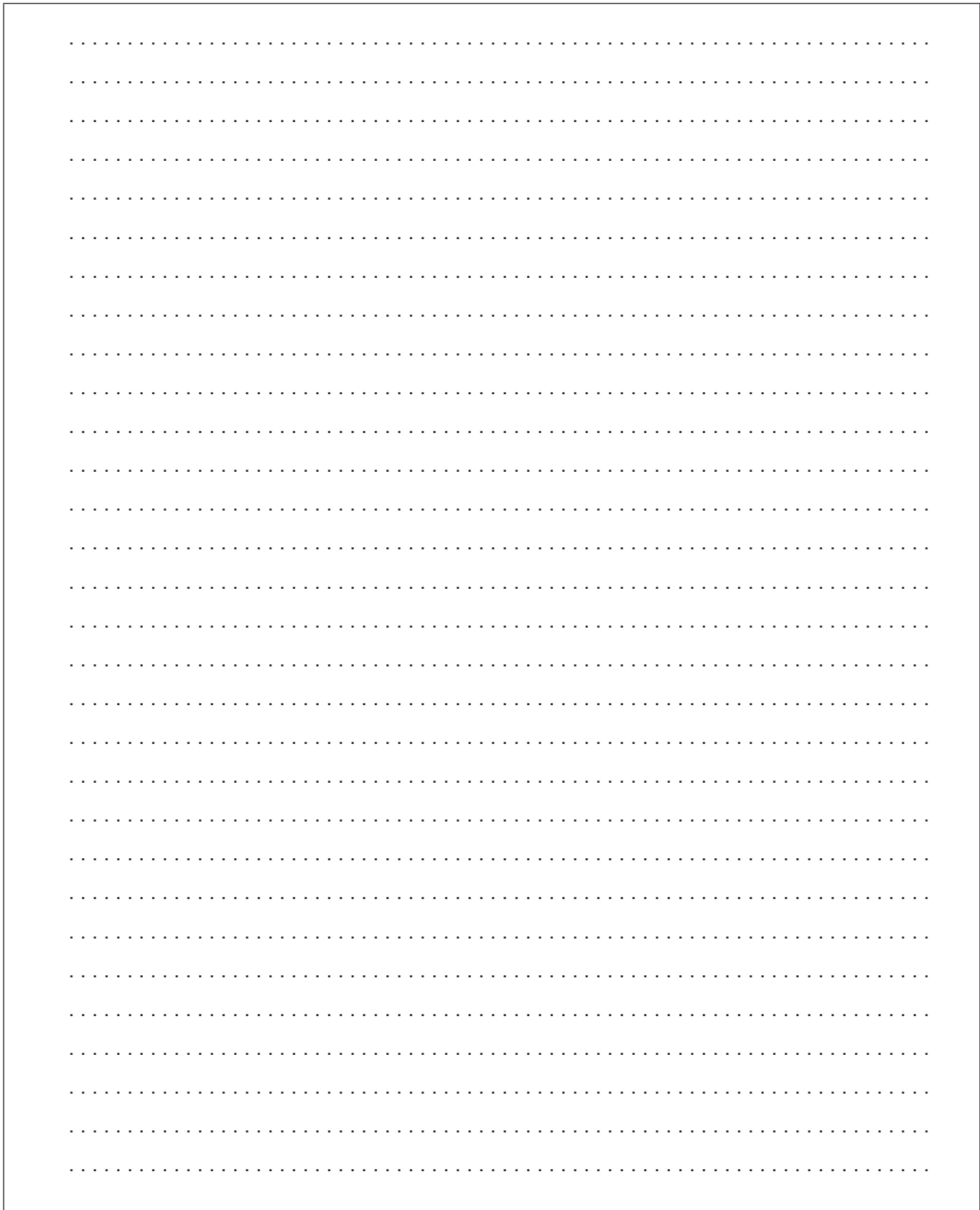
