SECTION A

Answer **one** question from this section. Candidates must use specific and clearly identified ethnographic illustrations. Each question in this section is worth [20 marks].

- 1. Discuss the link between a specific marriage form (*e.g.* monogamy, cross-cousin marriage or arranged marriage) and gender relations.
- 2. "A belief in witchcraft or shamanism or sorcery is mostly found among the powerless and marginalized." To what extent does your ethnographic reading support this statement?
- 3. How can the notion of ethnicity be used to promote or control the position of a group in society?
- **4.** Discuss how honour **or** shame **or** purity is used in the exercise of power and authority.
- 5. Choose any social symbolic system (*e.g.* religion, fashion, language) and show how it offers meaning and value to those who use it.
- **6.** "There is no such thing as a free gift." Discuss reciprocity in **two** societies in the light of this statement.

SECTION B

Answer **one** question from this section. Candidates must use specific and clearly identified ethnographic illustrations. Each question in this section is worth [20 marks].

- 7. To what extent does your anthropological reading support the notion that globalization is a threat to cultural diversity?
- **8.** Discuss the role of religious movements in the context of debates about tradition and modernity.
- 9. Discuss the contribution of anthropology to an understanding of **one** of the following: development **or** nation building **or** indigenous movements.
- **10.** Analyse the relationship between international migrants and their host society, making reference to social, economic and cultural factors.
- 11. Is tourism a form of modern-day colonialism?
- 12. Evaluate the issues that arise in the context of urbanization or industrialization.
