- 3. Compare the obligations of kin in **two** societies you have studied.
- **4.** Compare the social and cultural uses of myth and history.
- **5.** Minorities are often negatively stereotyped and this may legitimize and maintain forms of inequality. Discuss this statement with reference to **one** society.
- **6.** Show how **one** ritual may be understood in a variety of ways.

Answer one question from this section. Candidates must use specific and clearly identified ethnographic illustrations. Each question in this section is worth [20 marks].

- 7. Suggest reasons why some migrants choose to maintain contact with their place of origin.
- **8.** Discuss how the increased speed of modern communication systems or travel has resulted in social change.
- **9.** What factors need to be considered to increase the likelihood of a successful development project?
- 10. Provide an anthropologically informed comparison of **one** of the following pairs:
  - globalization and localization
  - colonialism and post-colonialism
  - development and underdevelopment.
- 11. Social relations have been commodified in the contemporary world. Discuss this statement.
- 12. To what extent do successful indigenous movements use modern media?
