- 1. Explain why a gift is more than just an object one gives away.
- 2. Discuss the role that consensus and coercion play in decision making.
- **3.** In what ways is religion both a social practice and also a belief system?
- **4.** Discuss the claim that in all societies men have more power than women.
- **5.** Explain how it is possible that two or more anthropologists can describe the same ethnographic context in different ways.
- **6.** Analyse the extent to which a person's position in a kinship system defines his or her social relations.

- 7. Ethnicity is often used to explain conflicts around the world. What can anthropology contribute to this discussion?
- **8.** Discuss the social and cultural impacts of globalization on indigenous populations.
- **9.** What kinds of pressures and processes cause change in systems of social control?
- 10. Discuss, with examples, the problems associated with migration toward towns and cities.
- 11. Some anthropologists become advocates for the people they study. Argue for and against this practice.
- **12.** What perspectives can anthropologists bring to our understanding of illness **or** epidemics **or** health?
