




Fig. 1 Visitor arrivals in Botswana (1987 to 1997)

Study Figs 1, 2 and 3. These are graphs drawn by a researcher to show information about the tourist industry in Botswana, a developing country in Africa.

Fig. 3 Age and gender of visitors to Botswana (1997)


- (a) (i) In which year did most people visit Botswana? [1]

- (b) Describe any other primary or secondary sources which you could use if you were collecting information to produce a report on the importance of the service sector in Taroudannt. [2]

  - (a) Using evidence from Photographs A and B identify problems faced by users of the roads in Taroudannt.
  - (b) Suggest practical solutions to these problems.
