A Schoolwork and leisure

One of the problems that many students have is finding the right balance between schoolwork and leisure time activities.

Discuss with the Examiner some of the difficulties of deciding how to divide your time.

- the activities or hobbies that you wish to enjoy outside school
- any difficulties you experience in dividing your time
- advice/guidance you get from parents and teachers
- how successful you are in getting the balance right

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Paper 5 Oral Assessment **B**

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B Problems of change

Some people find it difficult to adapt to new places – e.g. new schools, new areas/countries.

Discuss with the Examiner some of the problems that might be encountered when you have to make important changes.

You may wish to consider such things as:

- your own experiences of changing schools or moving house
- whether you always like or dislike such changes
- some of the problems encountered and how to overcome them
- help needed to settle into these new conditions
- any useful things to be learnt when adapting to new surroundings

You are free to consider any other ideas of your own.

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Paper 5 Oral Assessment **C**

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C Favourite ways to travel

Most people do a fair amount of travelling these days and usually have some choice with regard to method of travel.

Discuss with the Examiner some of your travelling experiences and your likes and dislikes.

You may wish to consider:

- a journey that you particularly enjoyed
- any unfortunate/bad travelling experiences
- how you feel about the various means of travel – planes, ships, trains, cars, buses
- whether you find the idea of travelling exciting or boring or frightening
- any future travelling plans

You are free to consider any other ideas of your own.

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Paper 5 Oral Assessment **D**

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D Saving and spending money

Most young people find it enjoyable to spend money and difficult to save it.

Discuss with the Examiner the enjoyable and the difficult parts of controlling your money.

You may wish to consider:

- how to make decisions with regard to spending
- where your money comes from – parents/other relatives/part-time work
- what you do about saving some money
- any difficulties you have in managing your money
- what advice you get from parents or friends

You are free to consider any other ideas of your own.

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E Things you enjoy at school

Most students find some aspects of their school lives enjoyable – other aspects less so.

Discuss with the Examiner your feelings about your life at school.

You may wish to consider:

- the subjects you find particularly enjoyable and why
- activities at school that you always look forward to
- aspects of school life that you find difficult
- sport and leisure activities that you take part in at school
- what you will miss most when you leave school
