- 1. (a) Study Source A and then answer the question which follows. Write down THREE ways in which this cellar was unhealthy.

Target: AO1/AO2 Recall of Knowledge/comprehension of a source.

Overcrowded, dirty, animal sharing room, hovel.

(b) Using Source B, and your own knowledge, give TWO reasons why there was little understanding of the cause of cholera in the first half of the nineteenth century

Target: AO1/AO2 Recall of knowledge/comprehension of a source.

- Level 1 Simple statements supported by some knowledge, eg Cholera is caused by bad air. (1-2)
- Level 2 Developed statements supported by relevant knowledge, eg Source suggests that people believed cholera caused by miasma theory. Lack of understanding of real reason - infected water supplies. (3-4)
- (c) Using Sources C and D and your own knowledge explain why the work of Pasteur was important in the understanding and prevention of disease in the second half of the nineteenth century

Target: AO2 Comprehension and use of sources.
