Scientists observe that as the creatures of the primeval seas died, their bodies sank into the mud and silt of the ocean floor. Here the sea-currents covered them with still more mud and silt. As time passed, the pressure of the water and upper layers of silt slowly hardened this sediment into rock. They do not, however, say how exactly the pressure of the water and the upper layers of silt slowly hardened the remains of the creatures into rock. They merely state that the bodies of the dead creatures decayed and disappeared but the outlines of their forms were preserved forever in the rock.

Scientists assure us that pressures from the inside of the earth slowly bent the rock and in places lifted it out of the water. What was once the sea-bottom often becomes dry land? By looking at these uplifted rocks, scientists can tell us that fossils of the ancient animals came to be preserved, in what they call the 'picture book of rocks'.

We now understand how layers of the fossil-bearing rocks have piled upon one another for millions of years. Scientists have proved why the oldest layers are to be found at the bottom and newer ones at the top. They have also shown that they can place the fossils in their proper time period by observing the sequence of these rocks. This gives them a clear and accurate history of sea-life, going back hundreds of millions of years.
