Question 1

Student Bounty com Explain why you should deal with Beatrice's instructions promptly and to whom you owe a professional duty of care.

Given the size of Beatrice's estate, outline any suggestions you would make to her to reduce the potential inheritance tax liability on her estate.

(c) Beatrice has telephoned you to say that she is worried that, after her death, her nephew Karl will try to challenge her will and have it declared invalid on the grounds that she did not know what she was doing. She has asked you to write to her about this.

Draft the contents only of a letter to Beatrice;

(i) explaining to her the requirements of capacity to make a valid will,

(10 marks)

and

(ii) making any suggestions you think appropriate to prevent any challenge by Karl being successful regarding her mental capacity.

Question 2

Student Bounty.com Mr Hooper tells you that he has considered the way in which the will was signed and has concluded that it is valid. Apart from the gift in clause 2 explain how the estate will pass.

The administration of the estate is proceeding well and you have prepared the oath for administrators for this estate and sent it to Maria and Hamish to swear. Hamish has called to ask you what is meant by the phrase 'a minority interest arises'.

How do you explain to him what this means and why it is included in the oath for this estate?

(c) Explain how inheritance tax will be calculated on this estate.

You do **not** need to provide a mathematical calculation unless this will help you to illustrate your answer.

(d) Identify and list everything you will need to submit to HM Revenue and Customs before you can apply for the grant of representation.

(5 marks)

(e) The grant of representation has now arrived. Identify and list **five** of the steps you will now take to complete the administration of the estate.

Student Bounty Com Having looked at your estimate of charges for his will, Mr Henkel is now (a) wondering whether to save himself the money and not bother making a will.

Your explanation above has persuaded Mr Henkel that he really does need (b) to make a will.

Mr Hooper has asked you to help him. Draft the clauses providing the gifts to Simon and Helen to be included in the will.

You do **not** need to draft the entire will.

Having approved his draft will, Mr Henkel has asked you to send it to him to (c) sign at home.

Draft an instruction sheet to enclose with the will, setting out how Mr Henkel should sign his will to ensure it complies with the legal formalities.
