Student Bounty.com (a) Explain why you are unable to accept instructions from Laura to prepare Brenda's lasting power of attorney.

(b) What steps would you take to establish whether or not Brenda is able to give you valid instructions?

If it is established that Brenda no longer has the mental capacity to give instructions to make a lasting power of attorney:

Identify the type of application that Laura could make to the Court of Protection and briefly explain its effect.

What would Laura need to lodge at the Court to make such an application? (d) (No credit will be given for form numbers only)

Following the meeting between your supervising solicitor and Brenda Leese, and it having being established that Brenda no longer has mental capacity to make a lasting power of attorney or will, her niece Laura brings into the office an Enduring Power of Attorney made by Brenda Leese in 1998 appointing her brother James Roberts and her niece Laura jointly and severally as her attorneys.

(e) Explain whether or not Laura can use the Enduring Power of Attorney now.

(f) Explain whether it would be possible for Brenda's will to be changed so that Laura, James and Henry can all benefit from Brenda's estate in the event of her death.
