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Question (stem)	Which one of the following characteristics of test execution tools describes best a specific characteristic of a keyword-driven test execution tool?
Correct Answer	A. A table containing test input data, action words, and expected results controls the execution of the system under test.
Distracters	B. Actions of testers will be recorded in a script that can be rerun several times. C. Actions of testers will be recorded in a script that is then being generalized to run with several sets of test input data. D. The ability to log test results and compare them against the expected results.
Justification for Correct Answer	This is a best-answer question that requires the recall characteristics specific to keyword-driven testing A is correct because action words describe commands for the application to be tested. Wrong is in B: This is the normal characteristic of capture reply tools. Wrong is in C: C describes a special consideration for data-driven testing. Wrong is in D. This is the normal characteristic of capture reply tools combined with a test comparator.
