 - (1v) 2/3 tentative statements of fact, etc
 - (v) An important cause / effect,
 - (vi) Valid introductory material

3. Marking

- (1) Starting from the beginning of the answer, tick clearly thus (/) each fact or SRS
- (ii) Cumulative Mark

 Award the mark/s agreed on the marking scheme to each fact or SRS

- (iii) Total the marks awarded to each part of the question in the margin thus (>) before marking the remainder Put the grand total for the question in a circle near the question number in the L H margin
