


The graph above shows how the amount of money spent on aid and on the military changed between 1992 and 2000. Examine the graph and then answer the questions which follow.

Read 'The Story of Yano' below and answer the questions which follow.

Yano

Yano is a Ticuna Indian. She lives with her family and about 1,000 other members of her people in a reservation in the Amazon forest. A reservation is an area of land set aside by the government for the use of the Indians. They are not happy with this as they have always seen all of the forest as their natural home.

Yano and her fellow Indians are descended from a very ancient people who lived in Brazil and other parts of America for many hundreds of years before the Europeans arrived on the continent in 1492. At that time they numbered about 4 million, but since then their numbers have declined due to violence against them and disease brought in from outside. Today there are only about a quarter of a million Indians left in the Amazon.

Yano says that most Indians like herself do not want to radically alter their way of life. They want to continue to live in their own areas, to observe their own customs and to speak their own language. Above all they do not want to be evicted from their own land by the government or by other business interests for whatever reason. Within the last few years the Ticuna have joined with other Indian groups to oppose the actions of the Brazilian Government and its foreign advisors and investors. More and more they feel that if their views continue to be ignored then they will have to become better organised to defend themselves.
