#### B. Transport.


Name and describe THREE methods of transport which can be seen on this map.


**B.** Referring to the factory that you named above, describe **THREE** reasons why it has developed at its present location.

A. Fossil Fuels and Energy


Examine the pictures above, which refer to fossil fuels used in today's world.

## **B.** The Importance of Water




Study this diagram carefully and answer the questions that follow.


