## Letter:

(40 marks)
$\mathrm{C}=$ Content mark (22 possible marks)
$\mathrm{E}=$ Expression mark ( $\mathbf{1 8}$ possible marks)

## General Approach:

Award content marks first, up to $\mathbf{2}$ marks per point. Section off each point. Bracket irrelevant bits! Identify each point by its capital letter in the body of the text, show letter and mark also in the right-hand margin.

If a sentence contains a separable verb and the prefix is missing, only one content mark is awarded. If two subjects are used, e.g., ich and du then one content mark is deducted.

Total all content marks (e.g., $\mathbf{C}=\mathbf{1 9}$ ) at bottom right of letter. Then award expression mark (e.g., $\mathbf{E}=\mathbf{9}$ ). Add for combined total (e.g., 28), write this to the left of the large A identifying the question, circled.

## EXPRESSION

Before awarding marks, use red biro as follows:
Underline all mistakes, but where the same mistake (i.e. wrong word choice, wrong tense-usage) recurs, circle the repetition: repetition of mistakes shouldn't be penalised.

Word-order mistakes: put a large W.O. in the left-hand margin, and $\underline{\underline{2} \text { lines }}$ in the text.
Use a wavy line where nouns do not start with a capital letter.
Where good points of language use, whether idiom, structure or other, occur, put a plus sign in a circle $\oplus$ in the margin.

Looking at your red biro marks, make a global judgement to situate the candidate's use of language in the appropriate category as outlined below. If content is 10 marks or less, use the reduced scale for expression and write 'Lower E'
