Points 1 and 6 do not require development. Candidates are expected to develop points 2, 3, 4 and 5: for 6 marks, candidates should expand content with a good range of vocabulary, idiomatic phrases and correct use of tenses and verbs.

Six points @ 6 marks each + 4 marks for layout (Introduction and Ending) of letter. Each point may be awarded up to a maximum of 6 marks. The following is a guideline only. (Ignore minor inaccuracies.)

Communication clear and accurate / point developed / good range of vocabulary /verbs and tenses correct.

Reasonably comprehensible to Spanish monoglot / point not fully developed / verbs or tenses often wrong, but some communication reasonably comprehensible / quite a limited range of vocabulary.

Basic communication / part of content comprehensible / basic language content / verbs or tenses mostly wrong / some communication. 1-2 marks

## Amended Marking Scheme for Reasonable Accommodation candidates

Please note the following guidelines for assessing candidates who have been granted reasonable accommodations.

## Section A

1) Candidates who have a waiver from spelling and grammar should not be penalised for spelling errors in this Section. The following guide should be used:
If answer would be phonetically coherent to a monoglot Spanish speaker = $\mathbf{2}$ marks
Partly coherent = $\mathbf{1}$ mark
Totally incoherent = $\mathbf{0}$ marks.
2) Candidates who have availed of the use of a scribe, spell-enabled computer or a tape-recorder should not be penalised for spelling errors.

## Sections B and C

## Reasonable Accommodations candidates

In Sections B and C of the Written Production Section, candidates who have been granted a spelling/grammar waiver should not be penalised for grammatical or spelling errors. Marks should be awarded for communication and vocabulary only. (See Guidelines below.)

In Sections B and C of the Written Production Section, spelling will not be taken into account where candidates who have availed of the use of a tape-recorder, a scribe or a spell-enabled computer. Marks should be awarded normally for communication, grammar and vocabulary.

## Section B: Guidelines for candidates with grammar/spelling waiver

Candidates who have been granted a spelling/grammar waiver should be assessed using the following guidelines:

Correct communication of message 5 - 6 marks
Adequate communication of message.
Mostly comprehensible.
Part of sentence comprehensible. 1-2 marks
No communication of message. 0 marks

## Section C: Letter 40 marks

## Reasonable Accommodation candidates

$(6 \times 6)+4$ marks $=40$ marks
Points 1 and 6 do not require development. Candidates are expected to develop points 2, 3, 4 and 5: for 6 marks, candidates should expand content with a good range of vocabulary and idiomatic phrases.

Six points @ 6 marks each + 4 marks for layout (Introduction and Ending) of letter. Each point may be awarded up to a maximum of 6 marks.

1) The following guidelines should be used for candidates who have been granted a waiver from spelling and grammar.

Communication clear and accurate / point developed / good range of vocabulary
5-6 marks
Reasonably comprehensible to Spanish monoglot / point not fully developed / some communication reasonably comprehensible / quite a limited range of vocabulary.

3-4 marks
Basic communication / part of content comprehensible / basic language content / some communication.

1-2 marks
Incomprehensible
0 marks
2) Spelling will not be assessed where candidates have availed of the use of a scribe, tape-recorder or a spell-enabled computer.
