Chess, a privilege of intelligence, and dice, which are subject to pure luck, gave birth to the most popular game of chance in the world – cards.

Many countries have tried to claim the invention of card playing, the world's favourite game of relaxation, but the fact is that there Is not enough information to demonstrate its precise origin. Because of the invention in China of paper which would take a thousand years to reach Europe many researchers also credit this country with inventing cards, even though the oldest deck to be found dates from around 1400. Nevertheless, there is earlier evidence in Europe to confirm the existence of playing cards. London's British Museum has a document from 1377 and the oldest one in Spain dates from a year later, in 1378. The rapid spread of cards and their early popularity is also confirmed by some laws of 1382 which outlawed games of chance, including cards.

Decks of cards and the games played with them vary from country to country. In Spain the deck has 40 or 48 cards with four suits: gold coins, cups, swords or clubs divided among 7 or 9 numbered cards and three figures: knave, horse and king. The Italians replace the clubs with canes, and kings are represented seated on their thrones. In France the cards run from 1 to 10 plus the figures: king, queen and valet, in squares, hearts, spades and clubs, and the English play with the same cards and figures but with different symbols: diamonds, hearts, spades and clubs.
