Any **one** of the following ex **4** marks Single parent to a seven year old son Edward, "He has given me the determination to keep going..." the responsibility of being a parent

9. Why do you think the programme is called 'PLAN B'? (6 marks)

One developed point ex 6 marks. The realities of business "forcing a rethink, a plan B..." sense of having to make alternative plans with respect to earlier plans, setting up a second business having failed previously in other ventures.

General content and layout of letter ex 10 marks

(b) Give **two** examples of where good communication skills would be needed while employed in a supermarket. (7 marks)

Two examples award 4 marks for first example and three for second example

(c) How has the Leaving Certificate Applied helped you work as part of a team? (7 marks) Two examples. Award 4 marks + 3 marks
