WIND FARM ROW FINALLY ENDS

The Express Times

The proposed plans to build a generating plant are finally set to go ahead despite the controversy over the proposal. The minister for the Marine Frank Fahy T.D. has welcomed the programme saying, "Today heralds the dawning of a new age of clean, green energy." The Renewable Energy Information Office has strongly defended wind power as a clean, green source of electricity. They state that Ireland's exposure to the Atlantic winds means that electricity can be generated here more cheaply than any other country in Europe. Wind farms can provide a useful source of income for farmers, whether they construct the wind farms or let their land for this purpose.

The Concerned Residents Group claims the wind farm would devalue property, destroy the scenery and cause pageiswe/Whof weindenteanbines look



like enormous airplane propellers mounted on tall metal poles and once the blade is mounted the turbines reach a height of 80 meters (260 feet). They claim erecting turbines in this area would cause a problem for tourism.

The group also claims that the visibility of wind turbines will reduce the value of property locally and goes on to say that the noise caused by them will render the property unsaleable. The Council upheld initial objections to the farm but the appeal made by developers to An Bord Pleanála are now allowing the plans to go ahead. According to the Irish Wind Energy Association Ireland now imports 86% of our energy needs. As we can produce our own energy from wind power this would help to reduce our reliance on the importation of fossil fuels. Burning fossil fuels gives rise to pollution problems.

The EU has set targets for the reduction of this pollution. If the government does not meet its renewable energy targets by 2005 it runs the risk of picking up an EU penalty in the form of a huge fine.

Increased wind energy development is government national policy. The government must increase the amount of electricity it generates from wind and other renewable sources. This will reduce the amount of greenhouse gas emissions and help Ireland to meet its commitments under the Kyoto Protocol.

AIDS Report

AIDS World-wide

In the past 20 years 58 million people have been infected with HIV. 21.8 million have died. In 2000 three million died due to HIV/AIDS and most of these, 95%, are in developing countries. Unlike people in the West, many of these will die – due to a poor health service and the high cost of drugs.

The causes of poverty are also made worse by AIDS; for example, illiteracy increases as children cannot continue their schooling and the education systems lose teachers more rapidly than they can be replaced. So what can be done?

- Government overseas aid must target those most in need.
- Drugs and other treatments should be made available free of charge.
- Education programmes to prevent AIDS should be provided to groups who are free of the disease but are most at risk.

AIDS in Ireland

The first case of AIDS was reported in Ireland in 1983. Today 2645 people are known to have HIV.

719 of these have gone on to develop full-blown AIDS. 350 new people contract HIV each year. 125 of these are among heterosexuals who now make up the highest number of new cases. 16 young people aged 10-19 contracted the HIV virus last year.

Alliance Sexual Health Center, conducted research among school leavers and young adults. They discovered that:

- Where they had been sexually active without the use of contraception the major worry was fear of pregnancy. Less than half were concerned about the risks of HIV.
- Most 15-17 year olds knew how AIDS is transmitted and prevented, but there was a lot of incorrect information among this group.

A growing concern for young people is the link between alcohol abuse and the unsafe sex practiced as a result which puts them at risk.




