- (a) You are allowed to use whatever materials, tools and design source materials as may be required to complete the test.
- (b) The following information should be written clearly on all drawing sheets:
 - * Your examination number and level.
 - * The name of your chosen craft.
 - * The number of the question you have answered.
- (c) At the end of the examination you will be provided with a transparent Craftwork envelope into which you will place the following
 - * Preparatory Sketches, if any apply. This must be signed and dated by your Art Teacher/Principal.
 - * One Preliminary Sketch, identified as such.
 - One completed craft item.
 [Where your craft item is three-dimensional it should be placed on top of the <u>closed</u> Craftwork envelope.]
 - (1) *Preparatory Sketches* on <u>one side</u> of one A2 sheet. 0 marks. This is your memory aid, completed by you during the week previous to the

examination,

and brought into the examination centre to assist you. It must be signed and dated by your Art Teacher/Principal, stating it to be your own unaided work. The Preparatory sketches may be a selection of personal interpretations and researched ideas based on the Question chosen. All drawings/sketches may be annotated and should show how ideas for your Craftwork have been generated.

- (2) Preliminary Sketch on <u>one side</u> of one A2 sheet. 10 marks. You must complete this Sketch during the examination. There should be <u>further</u> significant development of your ideas selected from any of the Preparatory sketches. It should indicate all the visual and functional properties of the envisaged 2D or 3D craft item such as – Form, Texture, Measurement, Contours, Decoration and Finish. A direct copy from the Preparatory Sketch will not gain any marks.
- (3) A finished Craftwork item 90 marks This piece of Craftwork is completed on the day of the examination.

CHOOSE ANY ONE OF THE FOLLOWING CRAFTS.

1. <u>BOOKCRAFTS</u>

(a) Design and make a folder to hold FAMILY AND DOMESTIC DOCUMENTS **OR** notes and cuttings on BAROQUE ART AND ARCHITECTURE. Use appropriate materials, colouring, and lettering.

<u>OR</u>

(b) Design and make a shaped (rather than rectangular) folder inspired by ART NOUVEAU suitable for holding information about this topic. Decoration and materials should be inspired by Art Nouveau.

2. CALLIGRAPHY

(a) Choose one of the following texts. Create a balanced composition using skilful, expressive lettering and simple images which help to express the meaning of the text. All or part of the text may be used.

(b) Choose **one** of the following texts as inspiration for a balanced composition using skilful and expressive lettering. Introduce colour, different letter size, textural or collage techniques, or unusual layout where appropriate.

3. <u>POSTER</u>

Design a poster where the style, size, colour and treatment of the <u>LETTERING</u> help to explain the message. Images can be used. Personalized, hand constructed lettering is preferred, rather than lettering made with commercially produced stencils.

Choose <u>ONE</u> of the following:

- (a) 'The Corridors of Power'
- (b) 'Headlong into the Voids of Time'
- (c) "The world is a comedy to those that think, a tragedy to those that feel"
- (d) "Who's that Girl [or Boy]?"

4. <u>WEAVING</u>

(a) Using contrasts of texture, along with colours based on rusty metal, stainless steel, reflective chrome, polished copper/brass, tawny bronze, dull pewter and shiny silver, <u>design and weave</u> a piece of material suitable for use by the fashion industry for disco wear.

Use a variety of yarns and incorporate several different weaves.

(Weaving continued)

(b) Design and weave a small tapestry based on **ONE** of the following:-

The River Bed Shades of Spring and Summer Loveliness Somewhere over the Rainbow Muddy Waters

N.B. Use a variety of yarns and textures in the weft. Other materials may be used to heighten the effectiveness of your design.

5. <u>LINO CUTTING</u>

- Design and print an image to decorate ONE of the following:-
- (a) A Birthday Card for a Friend
- (b) An Invitation Card to a Snooker Master Class
- (c) An Invitation Card to a Fashion Show
- The dimensions of your finished print should be at least 150mm X 220mm
- **N.B.** (1) Use at least three **printed** colours (2) Lino blocks are <u>not</u> to be submitted with the prints.

6. <u>PUPPETRY</u>

Design and make a durable, working puppet inspired by ONE of the following themes:-

- (a) Rock Chick
- (b) The Black Widow
- (c) Transformation

7. SCREEN PRINTING

Design and print an image based on **ONE** of the following themes:-

- (a) Sleeping Landscape
- (b) Sunshine in the City
- (c) The Contents of the Kitchen Cupboard
- (d) Under the Stairs

8. HAND PRINTED TEXTILES

(a) Using "Teapots, delicate china, sugar cubes and tongs, tiny jugs, iced cakes, confectionery, silver cutlery, embroidered table-cloths" or "Lego pieces and/or children's alphabet blocks" as your theme, design and print approx. ½ metre of repeat pattern on fabric. Create movement in your design. Use at least three printed colours, and exploit the use of overprinting.

(b) Design and print a fabric panel based on "The Haunted Castle" or "The Mop, the Broom and the Vacuum cleaner". Use at least three printed colours and exploit the use of overprinting.

9. <u>BATIK</u>

Using a suitable fabric, design and produce a batik based on one of the following themes:-

- (a) Fireworks
- (b) Pods and Seeds
- (c) Dawn Chorus

Create pattern, movement and texture in your design.

IMPORTANT You must keep hand painting directly on to the fabric to a minimum. Your work should be fully dipped in the dye baths at least twice during the process.

10. **POTTERY** Choose **one only** of the following:-

- (a) Design and construct a vase or container based on "The Chef"
- (b) Design and construct a HONEY POT for table use.
- (c) Design and coil, slab or throw a functional PLATTER FOR CHEESES.
- N.B. (i) None of the above (a), (b) or (c) should exceed 25cms. approx. in their largest dimension.
 (ii) Clay objects <u>must</u> be fired, decorated where possible with glazes, slips, or oxides. Paint and varnish objects <u>only</u> when fired to approx. 1000°C. Other materials may be added to the final piece if desired.

11. <u>EMBROIDERY</u>

Design and embroider one of the following:

- (a) A decorative hair band
- (b) A book mark
- (c) A pouch for a mobile phone.

Base your design on one of the following themes:

* The Garden of Eden, Adam and Eve, the Serpent, Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil, Cast Out of the Garden, Paradise Lost.

* Roses, full blooms, tight buds, falling petals, glossy leaves, thorny stems, new growth from old wood

* The warm dusk of mid-summer, shortest night, summer solstice, pearly light, clouds streaked with colour, pale luminous skies, bats at nightfall, trees in silhouette, silent countryside.

Use appliqué and different stitches, 3D effects, beads etc.

12. WOODCARVING

Design and carve one of the following:

- (a) A free standing piece or relief panel inspired by 'The Sungod" or "The Scavenger" Create texture and pattern in your carving.
- (b) A plaque to commemorate the opening of your new Community Care Centre.
- **N.B.** None of the above should exceed 25cms. approx. in their largest dimension.

13. METALWORK

Choose one of the following themes:

Using suitable metals and enamels design and make a plaque to commemorate ALL THOSE WHO HAVE BEEN LOST AT SEA.

Design and make a textured metal bowl, platter or container inspired by the practical use you envisage for the finished object.

Design and make a free standing RING TREE to hold at least 4 rings.

N.B. None of the above should exceed 25cms. approx. in their largest dimension.

14. MODELLING

 (a) Design and make a scale model for a large public monument to commemorate OUR IRISH CONTRIBUTION TO MUSIC DURING THE 20th CENTURY. Your Preliminary drawings should show the scale of your monument in relation to people/trees/buildings. The sort of environmental setting you envisage for your sculpture should also be indicated in your drawings.

 (b) Design and model a circular or rectangular piece based on one of the following themes: The Shipwreck Demolition Banishment Your finished piece may be free standing or in relief.
