SECTION I – ART IN IRELAND

- 1. Look closely at the *accompanying illustrations* of the **Broighter Collar** and the **Turoe Stone**. Answer (a), (b) and (c).
 - (a) Describe and discuss the design and decoration of each.
 - (b) Describe how the decoration was applied to each.
 - (c) Write what you know about their function.

Use sketches to illustrate your answer.

- 2. On the *accompanying illustration* of the **Tara Brooch** you will find different kinds of decoration. Answer (a), (b) and (c).
 - (a) Sketch and describe a piece of **geometric** decoration and a piece of **animal** decoration.
 - (b) Describe how this decoration was applied.
 - (c) Name and give a brief description of **one** other piece of metalwork from the same period. *Use sketches to illustrate your answer.*
- **3.** A street of Georgian houses is *illustrated on the accompanying sheet.* Answer (a), (b) and (c).
 - (a) Describe and discuss the features that make the architecture easily recognisable as Georgian.
 - (b) Describe and discuss **one** feature of the interior of a Georgian house you have studied.
 - (c) Name and briefly describe any other Georgian building you have studied.

Use sketches to illustrate your answer.

- **4. "The Death of Cuchulain"** by Oliver Sheppard (1865–1941) is an example of figurative sculpture. It is *illustrated on the accompanying sheet.*
 - (a) Describe and discuss this piece of sculpture and its subject matter **<u>and</u>**
 - (b) Describe and discuss any other piece of figurative sculpture known to you. Name your chosen piece and its sculptor.

Use sketches to illustrate your answer.

- 5. "Connemara Cottages" by Paul Henry (1876-1958) and "The Little Green Fields" by Gerard Dillon (1916-1971) are *illustrated on the accompanying sheet*. Answer (a), (b) and (c).
 - (a) Describe and discuss how **each** artist has painted a rural scene in his own personal way.
 - (b) Sketch a detail from **each** painting that helps to explain your answer.
 - (c) Name and describe briefly a painting of similar subject matter by any other artist that you have studied.

Use sketches to illustrate your answer.

6. Describe and discuss the work of **one** of the following artists: Louis Le Brocquy, Kathy Prendergast, Tony O'Malley, Pauline Bewick, Alice Maher, Robert Ballagh.

To help you with your answer use sketches and the following headings:

- (a) information about the artist.
- (b) subject matter/themes.
- (c) composition.
- (d) materials and techniques.
- (e) use of colour.

Section II – European Art

- 7. Describe and discuss either Romanesque **or** Gothic architecture under the following headings:
 - (a) overall appearance
 - (b) architectural features
 - (c) decoration
 - (d) name a building from your chosen architectural style.

Use sketches to help you with your answer.

8. "The Deposition of Christ" by Giotto (1266-1337) *is illustrated on the accompanying sheet.* Answer (a), (b) and (c).

- (a) Describe this painting under the following headings:
 - subject matter
 - composition and perspective
 - light and shade
- (b) Sketch and discuss a detail from this painting that shows Giotto is interested in the human figure.
- (c) Give some general information about Giotto and name and briefly discuss any other painting by him.

Use sketches to illustrate your answer.

- 9. Select a painting or sculpture by Michelangelo (1475–1564).
 - (a) Name, describe and discuss the subject matter and composition of your selected example. and
 - (b) Give some general information about Michelangelo and name and briefly describe one other work by him.

Use sketches to illustrate your answer.

- 10. "The Night Watch" by Rembrandt (1606-1669) is *illustrated on the accompanying sheet*.
 - (a) Describe and discuss this painting under the following headings:
 - subject matter.
 - composition.
 - use of light and shade.

and

(b) Give some general information about Rembrandt and name and briefly describe any other painting by him.

Use sketches to illustrate your answer.

- 11. Write as fully as you can on any **one** of the following art works:
 - **"Primavera"** by Botticelli (1446-1510)
 - **"David"** by Donatello (1386-1466)
 - "The Last Supper" by Leonardo da Vinci (1452-1519)
 - **"The Haywain"** by Constable (1776-1837)
 - **"The Kiss"** by Rodin (1840-1917)
 - **"Impression Sunrise"** by Monet (1840-1926)
 - **"Women of Tahiti on a Beach"** by Gauguin (1848-1903)

Use the following headings to help you with your answer:

- (a) subject matter
- (b) composition
- (c) background information on the artist.
- (d) your own opinion of the chosen work.

Use sketches to illustrate your answer.

- 12. *The illustration on the accompanying sheet* shows "Le Bal ou Moulin de la Galette," a well-known Impressionist painting by Auguste Renoir (1841-1919).
 - (a) Describe and discuss this painting under the following headings:
 - subject matter
 - treatment of the human figure
 - composition
 - colour and light

(b) Describe briefly the main characteristics of Impressionism and name one other Impressionist artist.

Use sketches to illustrate your answer.

- **13.** *On the accompanying sheet* are two paintings of interior scenes "**The Card Players**" by Paul Cezanne (1839-1906) and "**Harmony in Red**" by Henry Matisse (1869-1954).
 - (a) Discuss **both** paintings under the following headings:
 - subject matter
 - treatment of the human figure
 - composition and colour

and

(b) Name and briefly describe any other painting by either Cezanne or Matisse. *Use sketches to illustrate your answer.*

14. Choose either Cubism or Surrealism.

Answer (a), (b) and (c).

- (a) Outline the main features of your chosen movement.
- (b) Name and discuss an important artist from this movement.
- (c) Name and sketch a work by the artist you have chosen.

Use sketches to illustrate your answer.

15. (a) Describe and discuss the poster *illustrated on the accompanying sheet* under the following headings:

- imagery
- colour
- composition
- lettering

(b) $\overline{\text{Do you think that this poster is successful?}}$

Give reasons for your opinion and include sketches to help you with your answer.

16. You have been asked to organise a display in the Art Room or in the Home Economics Room or in the Science Room for your school's annual open-day.

Answer (a), (b) and (c).

- (a) How would you plan this task?
- (b) What techniques would you use to make the display visually interesting?
- (c) What techniques would you use to make the display informative?

Include sketches in your answer.

(a) Discuss this statement in relation to the *illustration on the accompanying sheet* under the following headings:

(b) Suggest a design for casual footwear for your own use.

Discuss this statement in relation to any **two** of the following products:

Use the following headings in your answer:

- (a) packaging material
- (b) lettering on the packaging
- (c) imagery on the packaging
- (d) use of colour
