QUESTION 1. ORDNANCE SURVEY

- A power station

• The built up area of Kilrush

- A golf course
- A national secondary road
- · A ferry terminal

(ii) Give two pieces of evidence that indicate that the river Shannon is a navigable river.

(iii) Using map evidence only, describe **THREE** reasons why the town of Kilrush is a tourist centre.

(ii) Imagine you are a town planner who has been asked to choose a site for a town car park in Kilrush.


Describe the most suitable location for the car park and give **THREE** reasons for choosing that location using evidence from the photograph **only**.



Select any TWO of the following statements and discuss them in detail:


(i) Forestry is a suitable use of the poorer land in Western Europe. (40 marks)
