QUESTION 1. **ORDNANCE SURVEY**

(ii) Describe and explain **THREE** reasons why the town of Carlow grew up at this location.

Give <u>ONE</u> advantage and <u>ONE</u> disadvantage of this <u>location</u> for the plant. Use evidence from the map only. (20 marks)



(i) Draw a sketch map to show how you would divide the whole country into **<u>TWO OR MORE REGIONS.</u>**



(iv)	The introduction of the euro into the E.U. region has been very successful.	(40 marks)


