GENERAL PRINCIPLES

1. MARKS

Marks are awarded out of a maximum of 80 per answer.

Except for the Research Topic (see separate page for Research Topic marking scheme), marks are awarded as follows:

CUMULATIVE MARK (CM) = 60 OVERALL EVALUATION (OE) = 20

Cumulative marks should be awarded at the end of each paragraph or paragraph equivalent and entered in the appropriate column at the right-hand side of the page. At the end of the answer, the CM should be added up (maximum 60 marks). Overall evaluation marks out of 20 should be added to give a total out of 80. The sum should be clearly marked at the end of the answer:

Example: C.M. 50 O.E. <u>14</u> TOTAL 64

The grand total out of 80 should then be written at the start of the answer beside the question number and ringed.

Care should be taken in transferring that mark to the **grid on the front of the answer book**, indicating section and mark.

<u>A running total</u> must be kept at the <u>bottom of the left-hand margin of the page on</u> <u>which each answer starts</u>. Take care that the running total comes to the same grand total as the sum of the individual marks for the answers. <u>The two total figures must reconcile</u> on the grids on the front of the answer book.

When marking <u>research topics</u>, the same procedures apply regarding totals at end of answer, ringed total at start of answer, grid on front of answer book, and running totals.

Examiners marking scripts through Irish should consult the special bónas table.

When marking scripts, assistant examiners should use <u>red pen</u>.

2. THE CUMULATIVE MARK (CM)

(MAX. 60)

Using clearly marked round brackets i.e. (.......), the examiner will block out the answer into <u>paragraphs</u> or <u>paragraph equivalents</u>. S/he will then evaluate each such paragraph and will award:

If the paragraph is **VERY GOOD:** 7 - 10 marks

- i.e. if (a) it is a really worthwhile piece of exposition or commentary;
 - (b) the factual information is accurate and substantial;
 - (c) it is clearly expressed.

If the paragraph is GOOD: 3 - 6 marks

- i.e. if (a) it is worthwhile;
 - (b) the factual information is adequate;
 - (c) the meaning is reasonably clear.

If the paragraph is **POOR: 0 - 2 marks**

- i.e. if (a) it is trivial or irrelevant;
 - (b) it has grave errors of fact or shows serious confusion.

PARAGRAPH/PARAGRAPH EQUIVALENT

- (i) A relevant <u>introduction</u> giving the background situation and/or defining the terms and explaining the approach.
- (ii) An episode, phase or stage in a sequence of events.
- (iii) An aspect of a topic, with supporting factual references.
- (iv) A point in an argument or discussion, with supporting factual references.
- (v) An <u>explanation of a concept or term</u>, with supporting factual references.
- (vi) A <u>number of relevant significant statements of fact, explanation, or comment,</u> which although not connected or related, can be put together or assessed as a paragraph equivalent.
- (vii) A good concluding paragraph or summation which is not mere repetition. (Summation which is mere repetition = 4 CMs max.)
- **N.B.:** The entire answer is to be blocked into paragraphs/paragraph equivalents. But irrelevant, insignificant or erroneous statements together with needless repetitions may be ignored.

3. THE OVERALL EVALUATION (OE) (MAX 20)

The examiner will then review the answer as a whole in the context of the set question and will award:

- if it is <u>EXCELLENT</u> in its treatment of the set question, particularly if it shows completeness of coverage, originality, very detailed learning or wide reading.

 (Equivalent to an A grade answer)
- if it is <u>VERY GOOD</u> in its treatment of the set question, i.e. is accurate and substantial.

 (Equivalent to an **B** grade answer)
- if it is a <u>GOOD</u> standard treatment of the set question, without being exceptional in the information or the commentary supplied. (Equivalent to an C grade answer)
- 8-10 if it is a <u>FAIR</u> attempt at the set question, but has identifiable defects,
 e.g. incomplete coverage, irrelevant data, factual inaccuracies, etc.
 (Equivalent to an **D** grade answer)
- if it is \underline{POOR} , fails to answer the set question but has some merit. (Equivalent to an E grade answer)
- if it is a <u>VERY POOR</u> answer. If at best it has only scraps of relevant information.
 (Equivalent to an F/NO Grade grade answer)
