- 1. For the first time the physical force strand, the constitutional strand, and the land agitation strand agreed to work together for the immediate purpose of land reform. Agreement between Davitt, Parnell and Devoy for above purpose.
- 2. Political and economic independence for Ireland. Dual Monarchy based on model of Austria/Hungary. Encourage native industry. Economic nationalism. Withdraw from Westminster and set up Irish Parliament. One valid aim based on politics or economics. Accept Republic.
- 3. Shipbuilding, linen, rope making, iron and steel works, or any spin-off industry from shipbuilding.
- 4. Break-away group from the Fenians believing in political assassination to further their aims of an Irish Republic.
- 5. Valid aim associated with co-operative movement.
- 6. One valid activity.
- 7. Michael Collins' Squad killed several members of British intelligence. British forces entered Croke Park and killed 12 people. Three Irish prisoners killed by crown forces while supposedly trying to escape.
- In accordance with article 8 of Anglo-Irish Treaty, to determine the future of Northern Ireland.
 To determine a new border in accordance with the wishes of the inhabitants.
- 9. A scheme to harness the Shannon waters at Ardnacrusha to create electricity.
- 10. De Valera government refused to pay land annuities to Britain. In retaliation Britain imposed tariffs on Irish exports.
- 11. Long time in office (16yrs). People wanted change after the war. Rise of new parties Clann na Talún and Clann na Poblachta. All parties joined together to deny Fianna Fáil of an over-all majority, etc.
