SECTION A READING

NOTE: While the use of words, phrases, or sometimes even sentences, from the text is acceptable in answering reading comprehension questions, a minimum of selection and manipulation is normally required at this level. Candidates will lose marks for irrelevant copied material. For example:

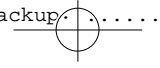
- Answer copied from text, much irrelevant material, no manipulation, no indication of having understood the question: award 0/5
- Answer copied from text, with some irrelevant material and some attempt at manipulation: award 2/5.
- Correct answer but no manipulation where it was required: deduct one or two marks as appropriate.

Journalistic passage (60 marks)

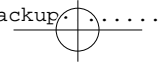

SECTION B (60 MARKS)

1. Literary passage (unseen) Sotto la Neve (Susanna Tamaro).

1. (a) Lei usciva da scuola, (ha visto passare il suo tram), è corsa per prenderlo/prendere il tram, è inciampata/è caduta. Un giovane l'ha sollevata da terra/l'ha aiutata e le ha chiesto se tutto andava bene
Mark out of 8. It is not necessary to include all these details to get 8 marks. Must include that she fell and that he helped her. Accurate Italian and appropriate manipulation is essential for full marks.

- (b) Ha raccolto i libri. L'ha accompagnata a casa. 6 marks (3+3)
(Failure to manipulate: deduct 3)

2. Literary passage from prescribed novel

A. *A Ciascuno il Suo* (Leonardo Sciascia)

1. Il farmacista prima è sollevato, quasi divertito, ma poi mostra una certa ansia/è un po' ansioso. Il postino e' molto curioso/incuriosito. Il postino sa subito che si tratta di una lettera anonima. Il postino dice che si tratta di uno scherzo. 10 marks (5+5)
2. La politica non gl'interessava./Non si occupava di politica/Non faceva politica
La politica non gl'interessa/non si occupa di politica/non fa politica. 8 marks
3. (a) Per il farmacista un cane era sacro come un dio/Amava molto i cani./adorava i cani/era molto affezionato ai cani. Aveva undici cani,che nutriva e curava come cristiani. Gli piaceva sentire abbaiare i cani/ Non avrebbe mai avvelenato il cane di un altro cacciatore. Any two points: 6 marks (3+3)

(b) Era il compagno abituale di caccia del farmacista/Era un buon tiratore/anche lui aveva un paio di buoni cani. For any two of the above, 6 marks (3+3)
4. Qualcuno voleva impaurirlo per non farlo andare alla caccia perché lui avendo buoni cani e il tiro infallibile ogni mercoledì prendeva molti conigli e molte lepri. /Perché gli altri cacciatori erano invidiosi di lui. For either,10 marks
5. The following points might be made **from the passage**:

- He is not interested in politics
- He is a quiet man.
- He loves shooting.
- He is very accurate when he shoots
- He brings home a lot of rabbits and hares
- He is determined to take part in the outing
- He is a loyal friend of Dr. Roscio.

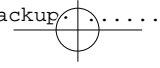
Maximum 10 marks for any two points (5+5)

Other relevant points **from the novel as a whole**: 10 marks (5+5) for two valid points.

B *Gli Occhiali d'oro* (Giorgio Bassani)

1. (a) Non fa mai troppo caldo/ Si riesce a respirare anche nelle notti più calde. L'Adriatico è più riposante del Tirreno. 5 marks (3+2)

(b) Perché vorrebbe vedere facce diverse da quelle di Ferrara/ Perché le sembra sempre di essere/di trovarsi a Ferrara/ Perché c'è la stessa gente di Ferrara. 5 marks



2. Perché aspetta Deliliers che non arriva./ Perché cerca Deliliers/Perché è ansioso di vedere Deliliers./Perché Deliliers non è ancora venuto/Perché non vede Deliliers. 10 marks for any of these points
3. Perché la signora Lavezzoli fa accenno al suo amico inseparabile/Perché parla di Deliliers/perché menziona il suo amico inseparabile. 10 marks for any of these points
4. (a) L'arrivo di Mussolini sulla spiaggia 5 marks
- (b) Non vorrebbe vedere uomini politici al mare/quando è in vacanza/è stufo della propaganda politica / è stufo della politica/non ama Mussolini 5 marks
- 5.. The following points might be made **from the passage**:
- Fadigati was highly regarded by the Ferrarese community before he entered his relationship with Deliliers.
 - Now he is looked upon with contempt, laughed at and ridiculed.
 - Signora Lavezzoli does not want her children to have any contact with Fadigati. They are not allowed to play tennis because he is there.
 - After his quarrel in public with Deliliers at the Grand Hotel he has disgraced himself with the Ferrarese community
- Maximum 10 marks for any two points (5+5)

Other relevant points **from the novel as a whole**: 10 marks (5+5) for two valid points.

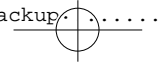
3. Essay on prescribed text (60 marks)

A 1 OR 2 *A Ciascuno il Suo*

B 1 OR 2 *Gli Occhiali d'oro*

Mark according to the descriptors in Appendix 1, bearing in mind :

- (a) It is essential to answer the question asked.
- (b) Reference to the text is important.
- (c) Deep knowledge of the text must be rewarded.
- (d) Quality and **not** quantity is important. Three or four relevant points, well-argued and supported from the text, are sufficient..
- (e) Inaccurate and/or irrelevant material to be penalized



SECTION C WRITING (100 MARKS)

Underline all mistakes with a red pen, but where repetition of mistakes occurs, circle the repetition: repetition of mistakes should not be repenalized. Use wavy line for spelling mistakes. For good points (idiom or structure) put a +. Quality **not** quantity counts.—simple, correct, Italian. Variety of tenses and phrases, rich vocabulary, link words and idiomatic expressions should be rewarded.

1. Written composition linked to the comprehension (journalistic) passage. (25 marks)

Content and communication: 15 marks. Use the descriptors in Appendix 2.
Spelling and grammar: 10 marks

- 0 – 3 Many serious grammatical errors, most verbs incorrect, many spelling mistakes.
- 4 – 6 Few serious—or frequent minor—grammatical errors and not too many spelling mistakes.
- 7 – 10 Good grammatical accuracy and few spelling mistakes.

N.B. It is not enough to copy or cut and paste sentences from the journalistic text.

2. Guided Composition (25 marks)

Candidates must not produce something learnt by heart and off the point. They do not need to use all the words or phrases given. Maximum number of words /phrases /points omitted: 2. What is required are simple, well-structured sentences.

Content and communication: 15 marks. Use the descriptors in Appendix 2.

Spelling and grammar: 10 marks

- 0 – 3 Many serious grammatical errors, most verbs incorrect, many spelling mistakes.
- 4 – 6 Few serious—or frequent minor—grammatical errors and not too many spelling mistakes.
- 7 – 10 Good grammatical accuracy and few spelling mistakes.

3. Formal Letter (50 marks)

- Date: 2 marks for month , 1 if capitalised.
- (Address and) Salutation: 4 marks
- Ending: 4 marks (2+2)
Distinti saluti (by itself) 2 marks
Some formula such as “In attesa di un Vostro riscontro/di una Vostra risposta” additional 2 marks

Content and communication: 25 marks. Use the descriptors in Appendix 2.



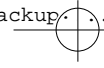
Spelling and Grammar: 15 marks.

- 0 – 5 Many serious grammatical errors, most verbs incorrect, many spelling mistakes.
- 6 – 10 Few serious—or frequent minor—grammatical errors and not too many spelling mistakes.
- 11 – 15 good grammatical accuracy and few spelling mistakes.

The polite form (Lei/Voi) must be used. The letter must cover all the points asked for in the question. The following suggestions are offered as guidelines

Letter (b)
Gentili Signori Mancini /Cari Signori Mancini
Acceptable endings: Cari saluti/cordiali saluti/molti saluti/affettuosi saluti.
