- Por eso haré todo lo esté en mi mano para evitarle ese calvario a Bibiana.

- > Sample Answers:
- Tachi's father also had a drinking problem.
- > She too had the best father in the world but when he drank he was horrible.
- > She hid herself from him (*yo me escondía*).
- > She didn't want to go out (no quería ni salir).
- ➤ She used hear her mother crying (la oía llorar y llorar).
- ➤ He drowned in a reservoir because of his drinking (tenía dentro del cuerpo más vino que agua).
- > She had a very unhappy childhood and her mother was unhappy all her life.

(Quotes may be given in English or Spanish but question must be answered in English).

- Any of the following points are relevant: (lines 33, 37, 42 and 47.)
- ➤ She considers him to be an irredeemable alcoholic (Es muy difícil que lo deje, si no imposible).
- Rogelio has harmed Bibiana and as she grows up the damage will become worse. (Ese hombre le ha hecho mucho daño a Bibiana. Y a medida que la niña vaya siendo mayor, le hará mucho más)
- > She reminds Don Tomás that it was Bibiana who brought money into the house (*cuidando niños y haciendo encargos*) and her father spent the money she earned on drink and on slot machines (*lo gastaba en vino o jugando en la máquina tragaperras*)
- > She does not think that the fact Rogelio has a job will make any difference. He will not keep the job for long because he will get drunker than usual and will not go to the office. They will fire him. (Se acostará más borracho que de costumbre, no irá a la oficina y le despedirán)

- **2.** <u>Language</u>: Spelling will not be taken into account. Examiners will award a mark (to a maximum of 25 marks) for vocabulary and elements of grammar which have been demonstrated.

Candidates with Waiver from Spelling and Grammar:

- **1. Content** will be marked as above.
- **2.** <u>Language</u>: Spelling and elements of grammar such as verb endings and agreement of adjectives will not be taken into account. Examiners will award a mark (to a maximum of 25 marks) for the <u>vocabulary</u> element of language only.

Note: In Q. 2 (a) and (b) minor inaccuracies (i.e. which do not distort 'message') should be ignored. **Verbs must be correct for full marks.**

Reasonable Accommodations:

1) Where a candidate has been granted, and availed of, the use of a tape-recorder, a scribe, or a spell-enabled computer, the following modified Marking Scheme will apply to Section C, Question 1 (a) and (b):

Content/Communication will be marked normally as above.

<u>Language</u>: Spelling will not be taken into account when allocating marks for this question. Marks out of a possible 15 will be awarded for vocabulary and elements of grammar only.

2) Where a candidate has been granted <u>a spelling/grammar exemption</u> the following modified Marking Scheme will apply to Section C, Question 1 (a) and (b):

Content/Communication will be marked normally as above.

Language: Marks out of a possible 15 for Language will be awarded for vocabulary only. Spelling and elements of grammar, such as verb endings and agreement of adjectives, will not be taken into account.

In question 2 (a) and (b) candidates granted an waiver of grammar and spelling should not be penalized for incorrect verbs.

Extra Notes:

1(a) *Dialogue*:

• Do not penalise twice for wrong version of 'how long it takes'.

1b) *Letter:*

- Letter can be loosely based on the suggestions given.
- Candidates are expected to make five relevant points.
- Each point should be expanded and developed. For full marks, candidates should write at least two or three sentences for each point.
